Bishop Dedicates School In Ithaca

Members of the Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus, who provided an honor escort for the Bishop, and altar boys were also in the processions.

THE SCHOOL WAS open to public inspection for several hours Sunday afternoon. Sister M. Aidan, principal and other sisters who teach there, welcomed hundreds of visitors. The entrance steps lead to the first floor. Flanking the door are the two cornerstones, one dated 1883, the other 1948. On the first floor are classrooms for Grades 1 through 4 and the office of the principal. Three huge windows, plus fluorescent fixtures in the ceiling, light each room, which are done in pastel shades of green and peach. The corridors are in buff tile.

On the second floor are rooms for Grades 5 through 8 and a room for an overflow class of first and second-graders. In the old section, rooms have been remodeled and redecorated for the kindergarten, a library, a music room, and additional classrooms.

The basement is equipped with a kitchen and two adjoining lunchrooms, extra classrooms or meeting rooms, a storage room, and a vault. The architect was John V. Larkin and the general contractor the War Construction Company. Other contractors were electrical, Norton Electric Company; plumbing and heating, Hill Heating & Plumbing Company; and painting and decorating, William M. Egan. Building materials were supplied by J. J. Driscoll Lumber Company, Cayuga Lumber Company, Driscoll Brothers & Co., and Robinson and Carpenter, all of Ithaca.

First Broadcast Of High Mass Goes Over WWHG

High Mass in St. Ann's Church was broadcast for the first time Sunday when Horrell station WWHG carried the entire service from 11 a. m. until noon.

The Mass was explained to the radio audience by the Rev. John D. Malley, assistant pastor. Comments heard later revealed that some of the non-Catholic listeners had an opportunity to learn the meaning of the Sacrifice for the first time.

The Rev. John L. Coonan, assistant pastor, delivered the sermon. Father Coonan spoke on devotion to the Holy Rosary, using as background the story of Our Lady of the Rosary of Fatima.

Mass was celebrated by the Rev. John McDonough, S.V.D. of St. Michael's Mission House, Conesus. Music was furnished by St. Ann's adult choir who sang Missa Brevis by Cary and the Boys' Choir, who sang the Gregorian Proper of the Mass responses and Credo.

The Boys' Choir composed of pupils of St. Ann's School were trained and directed by Sister M. Gabriel and Sister M. Raymond Joseph of St. Ann's music department. The adult choir was directed by Miss Dolores Hanrahan, with Miss Marie Pruner, organist.

Sheehan's Mark 61st Anniversary

then pastor of St. Ann's Church purchased this site in 1890 and gave it to the city for a hospital to be supervised by the Sisters of Mercy, governed by a board of directors which would include the mayor of Hornellsville.

Dr. Stewart, speaking on behalf of the board of managers, thanked the citizens of Hornell and surrounding communities for their "excellent cooperation" in making the expansion possible. Sister Aquinas said "I wish to take this occasion to thank each and every one for their generous cooperation and support in the recent campaign, which has made possible the breaking of ground for our new hospital addition. May Almighty God bless all of you for your kind interest and may He continue to shower His blessings on our work."

Reverend Mother Mary C. Callia, superior of the Diocesan Sisters of Mercy, also made an acknowledgment. Mr. Collins pointed out that the new addition and new equipment for the hospital offered a challenge to the medical profession.

Introductions were also acknowledged by Charles Northrop, representing the architect, and Morris Rowley, representing the contractors. The closing prayer was offered by the Rev. William Sempie, pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Canisteo.

The program was opened with singing of the Star Spangled Banner by the assembly and closed with singing of Holy God We Praise Thy Name, sung by the Sisters and nurses. Organ music was played by Miss Mary Elizabeth Loree, R. N., who also accompanied the singing.

that Father Toole has been pastor a great many changes have been made to the properties which included complete rebuilding and redecoration of the church, the addition of new marble altars, new pews, confessionals, floors and carpeting, Baptistery erection of new sacristies on both sides of the sanctuary, rest rooms, new lights and heating system.

This work together with the renovation of the school and convent represented an outlay of \$250,000. The master plan drawn up by Father Toole shortly after he became pastor calls for the erection of a new school and a new rectory to be constructed within the next five years. This will be the final major building program of the parish and when completed will represent an outlay of close to one million dollars.
