Field Day Plans Set By Mission Unit At Nazareth

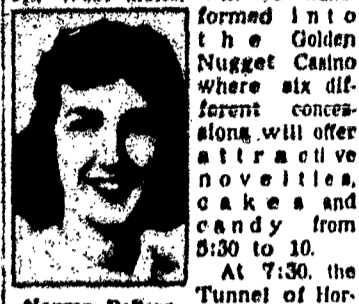

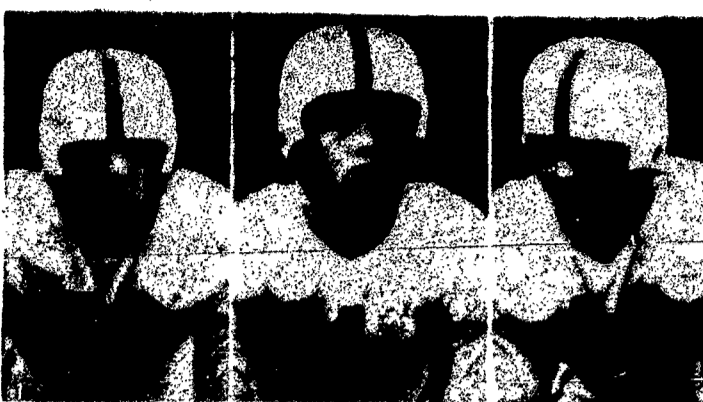

Unbeaten Aquinas Ready for 4th Win As Detroit Team Invades Stadium Sunday

Catholic Central High School of Detroit, the oldest traditional football rival of Aquinas Institute, will be sitting at the season's upset when they challenge the Little Irish winning streak of three straight victories in their sixth annual battle at 2 p. m. Sunday in the new Aquinas Memorial Stadium.

The Detroit Shamrocks hold a slender lead of 3 wins and 2 losses in the Aquinas series and although Micky Connelly's eleven has the edge from impressive showings this season the visitors have pointed for this game and will arrive in top form despite three defeats, one tie and one loss this year.

FLAGGED BY fumbles the Central High leads lost to unbeaten Boys' Town before 40,000 fans in Detroit Briggs Stadium last week. But previous games against bigger teams from Pontiac, Flint, Royal Oak and Fordson marked the scrappy Shamrocks as speedy and dangerous in any company and a team that is improving every week.

Rochester fans will see seasoned veterans in quarterback Jim Plecas, halfback Vic LaPorte, right tackle Captain Paul Kelly and Pat Reilly, rangy end who helped Plecas complete 14 out of 21 passes against Boys' Town.
