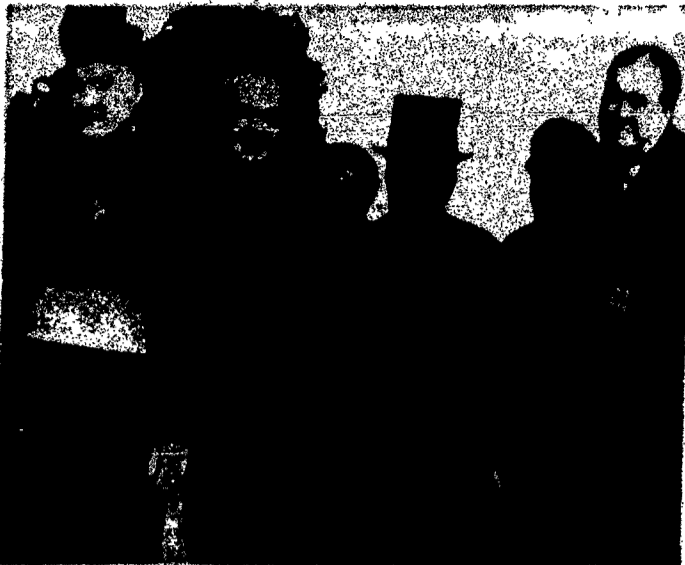

Cardinal Sets Obligatory Religious Education Program

Philadelphia (RNS) — More than 46,000 Roman Catholic children who go to public schools are expected to attend religious instruction classes here shortly. The classes will be held after regular public school hours and off school property.

Announcement of the obligatory religious education program was made by Dennis Cardinal Dougherty, who said it would affect 396 parishes in a ten-county area in southeast Pennsylvania.

THE PROGRAM represents a departure from custom for the

Philadelphia Archdiocese, which has provided only summer classes in religion for Catholic youngsters attending public schools. Under the present set-up, elementary grade pupils will receive two hours of religious instruction weekly and high school students at least one hour each week.

The program will get started as soon as an accurate census is made by the parishes of all children attending public schools.
