Diocese Curbs Teenagers' Costly Dances, Late Hours

Peoria, Ill. (NC) -- Strapless evening gowns, alcoholic drinks, high priced admission tickets, and midnight closing hours were outlawed for Catholic high school social affairs in this diocese. Mrs. F. P. Blockie, diocesan superintendent of schools, announced directives carrying the approval of Bishop Joseph H. Schlarman, were made public as 200 high school teachers from the diocese met in Rock Island this week for their first annual diocesan high school teachers institute.

THE NEW regulations, which reflect the parents' shock at "the disregard of the Christian standard of morals everywhere" are not new in Catholic high school circles. Similar regulations, it was said, are in effect in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee and in Cleveland, Detroit and Cincinnati. In some of these cities high school girls have conducted special campaigns that led local stores to stock formal dresses in keeping with "Christian modesty" and the regulations of their own schools.

Reds Run British 'Peace Committee'

London (NC) -- A new organization known as the British Peace Committee, which is currently flooding "likely" people and bodies with literature soliciting support, has nine known communists among its 16 executive members. It has now been disclosed. The British Peace Committee is preparing a "peace conference" here which aims to "carry forward the work" of the recent Paris peace congress. The latter brought together communists and their allies from all parts of the world.

During the morning, delegates and guests attended a panel discussion on Catholic Women's responsibilities, led by the Rev. Joseph McNamara and present-ing deanery council moderators the Reverend Fathers E. Leo McManus of Auburn, John Cosman of Hornell, and John T. Callahan of Rochester. NATIONAL PRESIDENT Mrs. Lucas defined the role of today's Catholic Woman. "The needs of the times make it imperative that she take an active interest in the community in which she lives," she asserted, "but she must be the good neighbor in a wider sense, in the state, in the nation. She must be the good citizen who uses her vote and her influence intelligently." Mrs. Lucas reminded the women of the "dignity and prestige" of the home -- "woman's greatest sphere of influence." "But," she said, "her responsibility does not end with the home." Summing up the official program of Catholic Action as "Pray for all, go to all, teach all," she named the home, education, economic life, and citizenship, as four areas of influence which "secularism is taking over."
