

Dr. Maney Listed For Friday Talk

The Rev. Dr. John E. Maney, secretary of His Excellency Bishop Kearney will address members of the First Friday Luncheon Club, Friday, Nov. 4 in Hotel Sheraton according to the Rev. Matthew Tobin, C.S.S.R., moderator.

Doctor Maney has been secretary to Bishop Kearney since January 1944. Prior to that he had served as Vice Official of the Diocesan Matrimonial Bureau and as a professor of St. Andrew's Seminary.

He was ordained to the Holy Priesthood at the North American College in Rome on July 30, 1936 and on his return to the United States made further studies at Our Lady of the Lake Seminary in Chicago where he received his Doctorate in Sacred Theology.

Lima Pupils Pay Final Tribute To Sister Rose Anita

Funeral services for Sister Rose Anita Wrenn of the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, who died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, Wednesday morning, Oct. 12, 1949, were held in Nazareth Convent Chapel, Pittsford, on Friday morning, Oct. 21.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rev. John M. Ball, assisted by the Rev. George W. Doud as Deacon and the Rev. Joseph J. O'Connell as Subdeacon. The Rev. Joseph H. Gelfell was Master of Ceremonies. The Rev. Louis Edelman was also in the sanctuary.

Present at the funeral was a delegation of parishioners from St. Rose's Church, Lima, where Sister Rose Anita had taught for the past eight years. Forty-five of the school children formed a guard of honor through which the funeral procession passed.

The last blessing at the grave was given by Father Ball. Born in Charlotte, N. Y., Sister Rose Anita entered the Sisters of Saint Joseph in 1907. Besides St. Rose's School, Lima, she had also taught in St. Francis de Sales School, Geneva, St. Agnes School, Avon, and in Corpus Christi School, Rochester.

Surviving are two sisters both of the Sisters of Charity of Emmittsburg, Sister M. Sienna, St. Joseph, Missouri, and Sister Jane Frances, Norfolk, Virginia.

Father Florack, expressing thanks to all wellwishers and committee participants, hailed the jubilee "as a time of thanksgiving to Almighty God and of rejoicing of His many blessings. Impromptu talks and songs featured the program, which at the speakers' table included the Reverend Fathers George J. Weinmann, Jacob R. Rauber, Edward A. Shamon, Theodore J. Winterroth and John B. Kleintjes. Closing prayer was one written for the jubilee occasion by Rufus Maier, committee chairman.

OTHER JUBILEE events included Solemn High Masses on Monday and Tuesday for parents and children of the parish and for deceased priests and parishioners, and the presentation Monday and Tuesday nights of a jubilee play by children of the school. Wednesday was a free day for the school pupils.

Some 200 families established St. Michael's Church in 1874. The present Gothic edifice was dedicated in 1890.
