

Bulgaria Forbids Job Changing

(CIP) — The Communist-controlled Bulgarian Government has taken steps to enforce its decree that workers "no longer have the right to leave their working places without permission," according to a broadcast of the Sofia Radio. Permission for a change of jobs is now granted only by the Labor Directorate, which takes its decisions on the "needs of production."

The Labor Directorate also has the power to assign those workers who fail to comply with the decree to labor battalions. The decree will mostly affect miners and industrial workers who have left the cities to return to farming.
