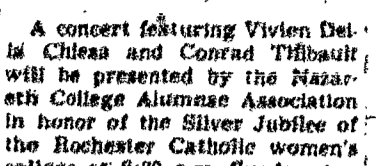

"LEHMAN WOULD AID PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS"

The Above, And Following Statements Made By Governor Lehman, APPEARED IN THE NEW YORK TIMES, October 16, 1949

Governor LEHMAN Said:

"I favor Federal Aid to education, which is sorely needed if we are to advance our standards of education." "I AM AGAINST THE BARDEN BILL. I am opposed to discrimination of any kind. The Barden Bill would obviously discriminate against certain groups of children in the furnishing of transportation, welfare and health services. As a matter of fact, I think it would seriously interfere, even in New York State, in the performance of services which the state has been carrying on for the benefit of all of its children for more than ten years".
