

### K. C. Scholarship Test Deadline Moved To Dec. 1

Date for filing applications for the New York State Council, Knights of Columbus Scholarship examination in 1950 has been moved up to Dec. 1, 1949 according to George T. White, Utica, chairman.

The New York State Council, Knights of Columbus offers eight scholarships throughout the state. In this area, one boy and one girl may win one each of the scholarships.

The scholarship award is now \$400 per year for four years. The sum awarded may be applied in whole or in part to defray the expenses of the holder, for tuition, books, and maintenance in any college located in the United States conducted under Catholic auspices and with a scholastic standing equivalent of the colleges empowered by the Regents of the University of the State of New York to confer degrees.

### 'Full Day' At Carmel Found In Prayer, Handicraft of Fine-Wrought Vestments

"Industry" is the watchword in Rochester's Carmelite monastery, 1550 East Avenue. It was Sister Elizabeth, the Out-Sister, who ushered us into the chapel sacristy to bring to our view a most delightful display of vestments, and the two sisters known only as Turn Sister and the Sacristy Sister explained the labor of love that goes on within the walls of the convent.

The main work at the convent is prayer, but when you add vestment-making to that, in the words of the Turn Sister, "a Rochester Carmelite has a pretty full day."

Each sister is an artist in her own right. There are two or three who do the delicately lovely hand-painting. Then expert machine stitchers and hand sewers go to work at assembling the vestments which are combinations of brocades and satins and the finest silks.

Among those we saw were vestments of brilliant red, brocaded in a star design and finished with rich gold silk braid. Another of brocaded satin had woven in its luxurious richness the symbolic IHS. Its cross was bordered with silk braid and adorned with a delicately-painted picture of Our Lady. These were but two of the collection and to say that each was more elegant than the one next to it would be a gross understatement.

The Carmelites have found that there is a great variety in the tastes of their customers. Some like lined vestments and others choose to have them of lighter weight. Some prefer a picture of Our Lord or Our Lady to an IHS or some other such symbol. The need may be for vestments for everyday use for which less expensive ones are chosen, or something elaborate for weddings or funerals or special feasts. There are conservative customers and those who prefer what are called "liturgical" models.

It is the desire of the Sisters to provide each of their patrons with his particular choice and as the patron generally likes to see what he is getting and have immediate delivery, the Sisters endeavor to keep a stock of fifty or sixty vestments in all styles and colors, besides several Solemn High Mass sets and various colored copes. Materials are kept in stock for customers wishing designs made to order quickly.

### Hospitals To Aid X-Ray Equipment

Whether it be for an "inside view" of your ailments, a treatment for various skin diseases, or a probing remedy for sundry internal illnesses, doctors today turn to x-rays for aid.

One indication of the tremendous importance of x-rays in guarding health is the fact that Rochester's voluntary hospitals in the first five months of this year used them on 40,206 different occasions, either as an aid to diagnosis, or for deep or superficial therapy. At that, facilities were scarcely equal to the demand.

That they may be better able to meet the health needs of citizens of this area, the radiology departments of Genesee, Rochester General and St. Mary's hospitals are to be expanded as part of the \$6,940,000 program for modernizing and enlarging Rochester's voluntary hospital system.

Completion of the Rochester Hospital Fund also will bring the most modern x-ray equipment to the north side, as part of the facilities of the new North Park Hospital to be built there.

### German Chancellor Adenauer Is Catholic Leader Foe Of Nazis

Bonn—(NC)—In Konrad Adenauer the German people have chosen one of the most distinguished Catholics of their country to be at the helm of the new Western state. A lawyer by profession, 74-year-old Dr. Adenauer has played a vital part in public life for the past 30 years.

Since 1917, he has been Mayor of Cologne, often called the "German Rome." For almost the same length of time, he presided over the pre-nazi council of State of Prussia and had considerable influence in national affairs as one of the most prominent members of the now defunct Catholic Center Party.

WHEN THE NAZIS came to power in 1933, it was a foregone conclusion that Dr. Adenauer would be persona non grata. He had been too outspoken against them and he was not a man to compromise his Catholic convictions. The new rulers deposed him from office and even banned him from his native Cologne.

Later, on the Gestapo arrested him twice, and he barely managed to escape when the big "purge" followed the attempt at Hitler's life in 1944.

Dr. Adenauer has always professed his Catholic faith unreservedly. He is a close friend of His Eminence Joseph Cardinal Frings, Archbishop of Cologne, and highly regarded by all members of the German Hierarchy. He is said to be a daily communicant. One son is a student for the priesthood.

AT THE END of the war he was chosen to head the Parliamentary Council at Bonn, which was the precursor of the new German federal government. His party, the Christian Democrats, having emerged victoriously from the recent elections, he became the logical candidate for the office of Chancellor, or Prime Minister.

Seven of 13 members of the new Cabinet are Catholics. Nevertheless, Dr. Adenauer will not have easy sailing, for his government is beset not only by violent opposition of the socialists whose policies remain fundamentally as anti-Church as they always have been, but also by many a divergence of views
