500 Knights of St. John Attend St. Boniface Mass
 Close to 500 Knights of St. John, uniformed and non-uniformed members, turned out for the 9th annual Corporate Communion at St. Boniface Church, Sunday.
 They received Holy Communion at the Mass in St. Boniface Church celebrated by the Rev. Dr. Walter J. Kohl, pastor, who greeted them and commended their public demonstration of faith.
 After the Mass the colors were retired and the men marched into St. Boniface School hall to hear Emmett J. Schnepf, Irondequoit Town Attorney and former FBI agent warn of Communist activity in industry and social activities.
 Schnepf who served during World War 2 in the Federal Bureau of Investigation said his investigation into subversive activities at that time convinced him of the need for constant diligence in checking Communist action in the United States.
 The knights were told that although Communism appears to be checked in the country at the present time, it is necessary to guard against any growth of subversive doctrine in the future.

Terry Brennan's Squad To Test Little Irish Sunday
 Boasting a 24-point average score in five wins and two losses against Chicago's best high school teams, Head Coach "Terry" Brennan of Mt. Carmel High School will bring a lively eleven, well-drilled in the Notre Dame T formation, to Rochester Sunday to tangle with the high-riding, undefeated "Little Irish" gridgers of Aquinas Institute.
 "WE WILL score two or three touchdowns and can promise an interesting ballgame," Brennan declared in a telephone conversation as he readied his lads for the trip from the Illinois metropolis.
 Brennan, who starred with Notre Dame last year, and his assistant, Ed Mieczowski, a '46 Notre Dame grad, are sound believers in the "T" Pro-stars "Ziggy" Czernobak of the Chicago Hornets and Johnny Lujack and George Connor of the Chicago Bears have helped Brennan train his "Carmel Caravan."
 Mt. Carmel, which has swamped most of its opponents in the Chicago High School league, considered the toughest high school league in the nation, has racked up 179 points to 79 for its opponents.
 ITS ONLY losses were to a strong St. Leo team, which outweighed the Carmel boys 15 pounds per player to take the contest, 26-13, and Fenwick, city champions, winner of eight straight games. Although it outplayed and outgained the Fenwick squad, Carmel didn't get the breaks and lost, 13-7.
 Standouts with the Chicago visitors are Quarterback Tom Carey, a good ball handler and fine passer, considered the best defensive quarter in the Chicago league; Lou Stigliano, 155-pound "breakaway" halfback; Paul Matz, 170-pound end, who plays a rough, fast game, and Dick Fraser, 170-pound center, who calls defensive signals and is a candidate for "most valuable" player on the squad.
 THERE WAS absolutely no question in the minds of 19,500 fans as to whom the "Player of the Week" award should go after last Sunday's 19-7 Aquinas victory over the strong Bullis Prep team from Maryland.
 Joe Schmitz, six-foot, 175-pound center, who apparently likes the opposition big and rough, had a "field day" at the expense of the "Little Admirals" of Bullis. Schmitz played a sterling defensive game, with three key pass interceptions, two blocked punts and great tackling. He was the unanimous choice of his mates, coaches and the Aquinas athletic committee for the week's award.
 Coach "Mirkey" Connolly's boys will be looking for their sixth straight win at 2 p. m. Sunday in Memorial Stadium by up-tracking Bullis, second of three
