Ceremony Commemorates 75th Year Of St. John's Church Building In Greece

Purchase by a congregation of 20 families of a historic Ridge Road West tavern --- the first building erected in the Town of Groce - insugurated St. John the Evangelist par-In there in 1865, at the close of the Civil War.

On Sunday, Nov. 20, 1949, nearly 400 families in the increasingly-populating parish adjoining Rochester will parcipate in a double celebration - the 75th anniversary of the present church building and the laying of the corner-sions of a new \$100,000 addition to the school.






