Funds to expand USO facilities such as those extended U.S. servicemen in Rome, Italy, are being sought by the U.S. State Citizens Committee of which His Excellency Bishop Kearney is a member.

Servicemen from Rochester Diocese are included among the men who are enjoying recreational and information facilities at the USO agency in Rome, two blocks from the Vatican, operated by the National Catholic Community Service. One of the prized services includes arrangements for audiences with the Holy Father.

Bishops from all upstate dioceses are on the fund drive committee. The Very Rev. J. Francis O'Hara, president of St. Bonaventure College, Olean, is chairman of the campaign in the southwestern part of the state. Currently a national campaign for \$10,000,000 is underway.
