Ukrainian Church Plans 40th Anniversary Mass

Fortieth anniversary of St. Joseph's Ukrainian Catholic Church, Hudson Avenue, Rochester, will be observed with colorful ceremonies Sunday, Nov. 27, highlighted by a High Mass in the Byzantine Slavonic rite celebrated by the Most Rev. Constantine Bohachevsky, D.D., Bishop of the U. S. Catholic Ukrainian Diocese.

Ukrainians will also celebrate the Silver Jubilee of Bishop Bohachevsky's consecration which the 65-year-old prelate observed this year in June.

ASSISTING THE Bishop at Mass will be the Rev. John Zuk and the Rev. Alexander Speranks, both of Buffalo. Arrangements are being made under direction of the Rev. Stephen Holowid, pastor of St. Joseph's, and the Rev. Dr. Aldo Rudnik, assistant.

Bishop Bohachevsky will preach the anniversary sermon. At 5 o'clock a banquet will be served in the church hall for the parishioners.

The Ukrainian parish had its

beginnings in 1903, when a group of Western Ukrainians settled in Rochester. Their spiritual needs were served by missionary priests from Troy, Elmira, Buffalo and Auburn.

Services were held in a rented hall on Clinton Avenue at Hand Street.

When parish membership grew to 100, the first St. Joseph's Church building project was launched. The structure erected on Remington Street was consecrated in 1910.

Four years later expansion necessitated the purchase of a larger building, the present St. Joseph's Church, located at 305 Hudson Avenue.

THE PARISH now counts over 300 families, Ukrainians from all over the city, operates its own parochial school of 8 grades, and has 21 active fraternal organizations. Since 1936, when the parish hall and day school were first opened, the Ukrainian school has grown to an enrollment of 190 children brought to the Hudson Avenue school in their own bus.

St. Joseph's is the center of Ukrainian culture in Rochester. Identified with the parish are these lay activities: St. Peter and Paul's Brotherhood, Ukrainian Women's Association, Branch 6 and 55, Ukrainian Gold Cross, Zaporozhka Sitch, St. Joseph's Society, Ivan Franko Society, T. A. S. Shevchenko Society, Ukrainian American Club, Ukrainian American Relief Committee, St. Anna's Sodality, John Onufryk American Legion Post, Boyan Church Choir, Ukrainian National Choir, Dramatic Circle, St. Joseph's Bowling League, Frosh Basketball Team, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Student League and the Holy Name Society.

C. H. D'Amanda's Rites Saturday

Funeral services for Christopher H. D'Amanda, Rochester attorney and active Catholic layman, will be held Saturday, Nov. 19, at 10 o'clock in St. John the Evangelist's Church at 90 1/2 W. 10th St.

Mr. D'Amanda, 46, who was also State Tax Commissioner, died Wednesday, Nov. 16, 1949, in Strong Memorial Hospital. He was stricken with a sudden illness at his home, 1045 Harvard St.

For many years Mr. D'Amanda served as Associate of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus. He was a member of Mosa Caravan Order of the Alhambra. An active member of St. John's parish, he also lent his assistance to the Church of the Epiphany, St. Rose's and St. Rose's Sodality.

In the Knights of Columbus he served on many committees and on Columbus Day, this year, was toastmaster at the annual dinner in Sheraton Hotel.

Active in the Republican party, he was named State Tax Attorney Feb. 8, 1943. He had served as vice president of the Rochester Bar Association and as chairman and member of many of its committees. He was a former president of Midvale Country Club.

Born in Rochester Oct. 7, 1903, he attended Rochester schools and New York University Law School. His offices were at 601 Genesee Valley Trust Building which he had maintained since his association with the late John J. McInerney.

Mr. D'Amanda is survived by his wife, Mrs. Aurelia D'Amanda; three sons, Christopher H. Jr., John P. and Robert D'Amanda; five brothers, Attorneys Alfred J. and Anthony G. D'Amanda, Dr. William D'Amanda, physician, Angelo M. D'Amanda and Frank D'Amanda, all of Rochester. He also was a cousin of Francis J. D'Amanda, attorney and Dr. Christopher D'Amanda, Rochester physician.
