Michael O'Duffy Listed For K.E. Eastman Concert

A bit of the color and charm of old Ireland will come to the Eastman Theatre on Sunday evening, Nov. 27, when Michael O'Duffy appears as guest soloist with Rochester Civic Orchestra, Guy Fraser Harrison, conducting. In "An Evening of Irish Music" Court Rochester Knights of Equity is sponsoring the concert.

The young Irish tenor will sing many of the familiar Irish ballads, including "Killarney," "Danny Boy," "The Rose of Tralee" and "The Harp That Once Thru Tara's Hall." Guy Fraser Harrison has selected a program of appropriate Irish melodies for the orchestral selections.

O'DUFFY, WHO was born in County Kerry 29 years ago has completely charmed American radio listeners with his soft brogue and his golden tenor voice since his debut here a year ago.

The second most popular singer in Great Britain in 1948, he was brought to this country by WOR and has had his own program over the Mutual Network ever since. Reported Paul Dennis in the New York Post following O'Duffy's first performance: "A refreshing new singer is Michael O'Duffy. He has a melodious high tenor and a charming brogue and reminds me of the time when Morton Downey had more voice and less style. O'Duffy's rendition of Irish and concert numbers is a pleasure."
