Second Ex-Chaplain Of Legion Dies

Death of a former national chaplain of the American Legion last week in Cincinnati, Ohio, came only two weeks after the death of the Rev. Dr. George F. Kettell of Rochester, also a former national chaplain.

Funeral rites were celebrated in Cincinnati on Friday for the Rev. William P. O'Connor, 60, chaplain of the Disabled American Veterans of World War I; Father O'Connor, who served as chaplain of the 136th Field Artillery in World War I and the 37th Division in World War II, was pastor of St. Catherine Church, Westwood, Ohio.

Father O'Connor, who died in a hospital, represented American war veterans at the dedication of monuments in Belgium, France and England. Burial was in Dayton, his native city. Surviving him are six sisters, two of them in religious orders, and two brothers.

Father Kettell, 62, pastor of St. Mary's Church, Rochester, was killed in an automobile accident Oct. 19. He was named national chaplain of the Legion in 1929—the first Catholic priest, as well as the first clergyman from New York State, to hold that post.
