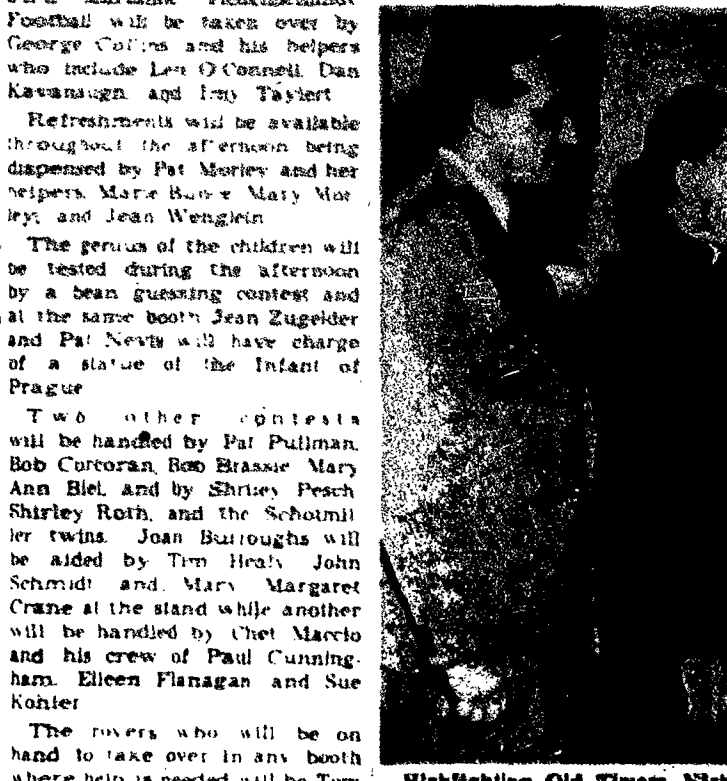

Rochester Students Form Club At LeMoyn College

Gerald Stiner, 477 Sherman St., was elected president of the Le Moyn Club of Rochester, an organization of young men of this city who attend LeMoyn College in Syracuse. Other officers are Harry C. Lane, 300 St. Paul Blvd., as vice-president, and John J. Conside, 383 Avia St., and Gerald H. Tucker, 87 Clay Avenue, re-elected treasurer and secretary respectively.

AN EFFORT to provide Christmas employment for members of the LeMoyn Club is among proposals slated to be put into effect this year by the new officers with the cooperation of the membership. Other plans are a car pool to and from Rochester at a reasonable fee, sponsorship of the first basketball rally for the students of the whole college, naming of a "historian," another smoker, a skating party, and other social functions.

First formal meeting of the Club took place in March, 1949. Officers then were Richard Brown, 264 Rutgers, president; Stiner, then vice-president; Conside and Tucker, Total membership was 28.

PRIMARY PURPOSE of this association of students from Rochester was to benefit Le Moyn College, and to assist member students from the Rochester area in any needed project such as finances, housing. Activities sponsored by the club include a smoker at the Knights of Columbus building in Syracuse a picnic during the summer. One half the profits of the smoker went to the Father Egan Fund as aid for needy students. Among incoming freshmen welcomed at the picnic were the well-known Brindisi dancing duo, Don and Tom, 942 Dewey Avenue.

Activities of individual club members were highlighted by the election to three members to the student Council of the school and participation of some in the oratorical, theatrical and religious groups connected with the school.

The Club has pledged itself to give its support to the college's program to assure that the eventual products of the Jesuit foundation will be educated Christian men and women prepared to step into an active role in their community's life.
