Japan Bishops Express Fear Of Communism

Tokyo — (NC) — Six out of the 11 members of the Japanese Hierarchy, interviewed by this correspondent, answered "communism" when asked what they believed to be the greatest danger threatening the Church in Japan today...

"A YEAR AGO I would have answered communism," said Bishop Paul Yamaguchi of Nagasaki. "Now I see less fear from that source and more to fear from religious indifference."

"After the St. Francis Xavier celebrations last June, the Japanese communists began to lose ground," said Bishop Wakida of Yokohama. "We must still fear interference from communists abroad."

Asked, "What do you regard as the greatest need of the Church?" Archbishop Packer Tatsuaki of Tokyo replied: "More churches and more personnel."

THE REPLY to this query reflected the variety of circumstances and problems in different parts of Japan. "Our greatest need is to develop the press," replied Bishop Paul Taguchi of Osaka, a great publishing center.

"More schools for boys," answered Bishop Wakida. "Non-Christian parents on all sides are asking us to accept their boys in our Catholic schools. We have too few schools for boys."

"WE NEED priests who can lead in the field of social relations and in the apostolate to the workers," said Bishop Dominio Fukuhara, whose southern diocese of Fukuoka includes mining and other industrial centers.

"To most Protestants," Mr. Meyer said, "the Roman Catholic ceremonies and reasoning behind them are usually impenetrable mysteries. A deeper regard for the ways of worship and feelings of Catholics has resulted from these addresses."

"Greater social consciousness in our city," was the reply of Bishop Michael Urakawa of Sendai.
