**Hospital Wing Dedication Set At 'Father Baker's'**

Week-long opening ceremonies of the new addition to Our Lady of Victory Hospital, Lackawanna, will be inaugurated Thursday, Dec. 8, at 4 p. m., when Most Rev. John F. O'Hara, C.S.C., Bishop of Buffalo, blesses the new wing which has been under construction for over two years.

This announcement was made last night by Rev. Joseph M. McPherson, superintendent of Father Baker's Homes of Charity, of which the 30-year-old hospital is a unit. He stated that the new wing will be named in honor of Dr. Michael A. Sullivan, a long friend of Rt. Rev. Msgr. Nelson H. Baker, with whom he worked tirelessly for the physical needs of Our Lady of Victory Hospital.

Dr. Sullivan died in March 1948. Father McPherson also stated that the opening of this new division coincided with the 30th anniversary of the building of the original hospital which was formally opened and dedicated Oct. 2, 1919.

THE GENERAL public is invited to the dedication ceremonies which will begin in the hospital nurse's home auditorium. After Father McPherson's address of welcome to Bishop O'Hara and guests, the Bishop and attendants will proceed to the new wing.

The hospital students will sing a hymn after which Bishop O'Hara will give the new institution his general blessing. He will then visit and bless each room individually.

Following the blessing Bishop O'Hara will address the assembly briefly. Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament will conclude the dedication ceremonies. A special altar is being erected in the auditorium.

Open House will be held until 7 p. m. for the general public. Hospital nurses will act as hostesses.
