St. Anthony's Mass To Mark Anniversary

Sunday will mark the anniversary of the dedication of the new St. Anthony's church and school in Elmira replacing the structure completely destroyed by fire on Feb. 26, 1947.

A Solemn High Mass will be celebrated at 8:15 o'clock with priests of the parish participating.

The anniversary observance again brings to light the total loss suffered by the parish when their parochial school and church was reduced to ruins in the disastrous fire. The church mortgage had been liquidated four months previous with suitable ceremonies.

IN LESS THAN thirty days, a city-wide campaign was launched to raise funds to replace the structure and after two weeks' whirlwind campaign nearly \$175,000 was subscribed, thus assuring the Rev. Albert L. Simonetti pastor that he could proceed with plans to rebuild.

The church and school now stands as one of the most modern and completely equipped in the area.

Bishop Confirms 282 In Corning

Corning, The Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester, conferred the Sacrament of Confirmation on three classes of children and adults Sunday afternoon in St. Vincent de Paul's Church, St. Patrick's and St. Mary's Churches.

In the first ceremony of the afternoon at 2 o'clock at St. Vincent de Paul's Church, 103 children and 18 adults were confirmed. At 3:30 o'clock, 38 children and 20 adults received the Sacrament at St. Patrick's Church. St. Mary's class at 5 p. m. was made up of 83 children and 20 adults.

Friars of Atonement Seminary Dedicated By Bishop Kearney In Montour Falls Rite

Montour Falls—Adorned with the Church Unity movement officially were established in Rochester Diocese on Tuesday with the dedication of the new St. John's Atonement Seminary here by His Excellency Bishop Kearney.

Franciscan Friars of the Society of the Atonement, whose headquarters are in Graymour at Garrison, N. Y., will conduct the seminary, which will be opened for 51 students to be transferred from Graymour on Jan. 4.

Located in the former Cook Academy building, which was purchased by the Society in 1948 and remodeled at a cost of \$500,000, the new institution becomes the seventh seminary in the diocese.

"THAT ALL May Be One"—the motto of the Society—was the keynote of Bishop Kearney's sermon at the Solemn Pontifical Mass of dedication in the seminary chapel which some 400 persons filled to overflowing.

Talking as his theme the words of the Gospel Transfiguration scene, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. Let us build three tabernacles," the Bishop likened the tabernacles to (1) the Atonement community; (2) the spirit of the Franciscan life; and (3) the Unity of Christendom, the aim of the Society.
