

### Another \$10,000 For Elmira Nuns Needed In Drive

With \$12,577 raised to date in the enrollment campaign for the Association of the Perpetual Rosary, Chairman Harry J. LaMotte is urging diocesan-wide renewal of effort to help the Sisters in the Dominican Monastery on Rosary Hill, Elmira.

Funds being raised will be used to provide an estimated \$20,000 in addition to the monastery to provide for increased spiritual works of the Dominican Sisters.

The \$12,577 report was made at a meeting in Columbus Center, Elmira, it represents a little more than half of the amount needed.

Present building of the monastery is taxed to capacity and the Sisters hope that sufficient funds may be raised through the drive to proceed with extension plans.

A preliminary report shows the breakdown of the funds raised up to this time by areas in the diocese. Figures are: Elmira, \$6,770.00; Rochester, \$2,404; Buffalo, \$505; Hornell, \$372; Horseheads, \$343; Corning, \$337; Elmira Heights, \$282; Waverly, \$110; Auburn-Ithaca, \$102; Watkins Glen, \$54; Miscellaneous \$992.

### Mothers Club Names Aides For Card Party At Aquinas

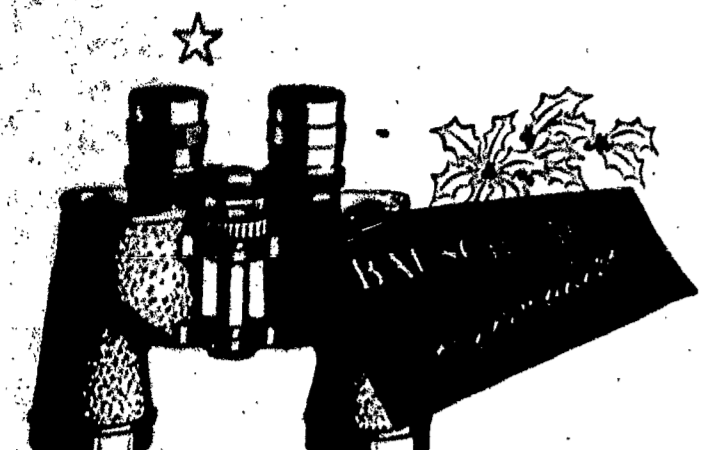
