Mrs. Rogers Tells How Saint Aided Conversion

A "flea-bitten saint flitting about in the treetops" was a factor in the conversion of Mrs. Elizabeth Cobb Rogers, the daughter of Irwin S. Cobb, informed an amused Aquinas Christian Culture Lecture audience Sunday evening. Mrs. Rogers, a close friend and Godchild of Clare Booth Luce, who was converted by Monsignor Fulton J. Sheen, described her "pilgrimage from agnosticism to light" in her talk titled "A Feud with St. Joseph".

The UNSANITARY holy man in question was St. Joseph Cupertino, a seventeenth-century Franciscan priest who was gifted with the quality of levitation. As an agnostic, Mrs. Rogers related, she was unimpressed by stories of St. Joseph Cupertino a poor and ignorant man who couldn't write well enough to qualify, without special dispensation for ordination to the priesthood. She was repulsed by a story told by Clare which described the ability of the saint to achieve such complete detachment from the world that he rose from the ground and remained suspended in air, Mrs. Rogers asserted.

IT WAS THEN, she said she made the remark that if Clare thought a "flea-bitten saint flitting about in the tree tops" was an irresistible lure to join the Catholic Church she was mistaken. Several coincidences involving St. Joseph Cupertino followed, one a favor obtained by attending a Mass on September 18, feastday of the saint through whom many miracles have been worked, which convinced Mrs. Rogers. She went to see Monsignor Sheen.

The witty daughter of humorist Cobb described her trip to Europe just completed in the company of Clare Booth Luce. She said she was impressed by Fatima, where she met the parents of two of the children who talked with the Blessed Mother in her appearances at the now famous shrine. The spirit of Fatima is there in the homes of these parents, she asserted. They live in poverty in two rooms, she said, but they have an "exquisite dignity." They are the kind of people who had children who could not lie.

Nazareth Beats Men Debaters

Nazareth College debaters scored two victories over male debating teams last weekend when they defeated speakers at Niagara University and the University of Buffalo in the opening matches of their winter series.

Jane Yvonne Koenen of Auburn and Sheila O'Grady of Rochester, both sophomores, represented Nazareth's Forensic Society in upholding the negative of the debate proposition "Resolved, That the basic non-agricultural industries of the country should be nationalized." Practice debates against speakers from the University of Rochester have already been held. Besides future return meetings here with Buffalo and Niagara, the Nazareth team will face Le Moyne College and the University of Syracuse debaters next semester.
