

Connolly Signs For 3 Years At Aquinas

Harry "Mickey" Connolly, Aquinas head football coach, today signed a three-year contract to remain in charge of "Little Irish" athletic activities, according to the Rev. Eugene A. Cullinane, C.M.S., principal of Aquinas Institute.

Connolly, former Boston College star, succeeded popular and successful Harry Wright last Spring as Aquinas football director. In his first season he drove the Dewey Avenue griders through the toughest schedule in Aquinas' football history with 7 victories and 1 defeat.

Joined Connolly in the three-year contract was his football assistant, Basil Marella, who is currently serving as Aquinas head basketball coach. The basketball team opens its season this Friday night, Dec. 16, at the Rochester Sports Arena battling Kany Prep of Erie, Pa.

Father Cullinane praised the coaches in announcing their new contracts. "The assurance that Mickey Connolly will be with us at Aquinas for at least three more years," he said, "will bring joy and great satisfaction to our students, our faculty, our alumni and our great number of loyal friends."

"Mickey is far more than an outstanding football coach. As Director of Physical Education at Aquinas he will make a much greater contribution to our educational work in the fields of guidance and good counseling for which he is admirably suited."

"Mickey Connolly and Basil Marella both combine within themselves those splendid qualities of leadership and inspiration which are required to bring out of our boys the finest spiritual and physical ideals of young manhood."

Connolly had the following to say: "Our relations with both Father Cullinane and Father Carter have at all times been most pleasant. We like Aquinas and Rochester very much and will continue to give our very best. It's a little early to speak of 1950 but we can promise sincerely that Aquinas will field a well-drilled and well-conditioned team next Fall."
