The sick person on coming to Lourdes must present a precisè case, diagnosed by medical authorities and verified by the Lourden Bureau. After bathing at the shrine, the 'cured" person must appear eain before the bureau, which outs him under observation for everal days.

THE NEXT STEP is for the 'cured" person to be examined y specialists, believers or nombefore, finally, his detailed dossier is addressed to the religious.
