Crawley of Miami, Fla.; two sons, Donald H. of Geneva, and Thomas J. Jennings, U. S. vice consul at Bordeaux, France; two sisters, Mrs. Kathryn Peglow and Mrs. Cella Hobbins both of Rochester; and three grandchildren.

Mr. Jennings was a native of Ireland where he was born in Castlebar, County Mayo. He came to this country as a youth and had resided in Geneva ever since. He was a member of the Holy Name Society of St. Stephen's church.

Rev. Raymond Nolan was celebrant of the solemn high funeral Mass. Rev. Robert H. Fennessy was deacon and Rev. John W. Brill, subdeacon. Rt. Rev. Msgr. William H. McPadden of St. Stephen's church, and Rev. Joseph O'Connell, chaplain of Nazareth Academy of Rochester, were in the sanctuary.
