Mt. Morris Priest Named Aide To Florida Bishop

Appointment of the Rev. William T. Larkin, S.T.D., of Mt. Morris as secretary to Auxiliary Bishop Thomas J. McDonough of St. Augustine, Florida, has been announced in the Florida hierarchy.

Father Larkin, one of three Rochester Diocese priests ordained for the St. Augustine Diocese, was named to the post of secretary on his return from Rome, where he received his degree of Doctor of Sacred Theology from Angelicum University last month.

Studying in Rome also were the Rev. Father Robert Schiefen, J.C.L., and the Rev. William P. Conrad, J.C.L., both of whom received graduate degrees of Licentiate in Canon Law from the Lateran University.

Father Larkin was ordained May 15, 1947 in Syracuse by the Most Rev. Bishop Walter A. Foery. Born in Mt. Morris, he is the son of Mr. and Mrs. William T. Larkin.

His classmate, Father Conrad, was also ordained by Bishop Foery in the same ceremony. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Francis V. Conrad of Andover, he has been named assistant pastor of St. Paul's parish, Jacksonville, Florida.

Father Schiefen was ordained Oct. 18, 1946 by Bishop James E. Kearney of Rochester. A native of Rochester, where he was a member of St. Ambrose Parish, he is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald F. Schiefen.

Enroute With Cheer For Veterans

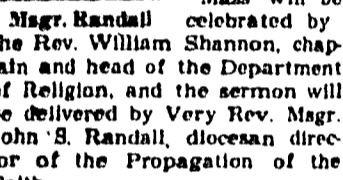

Nazareth College To Join In Church Unity Octave

Students at Nazareth College will join with millions of Catholics all over the world in the observance of the Church Unity Octave from Jan. 18 to 25, to pray "that they all may be one."

This eight-day period of prayer for the reunion of Christendom, under the authority of the Pope Christ's Vicar on earth, will open at Nazareth College with a High Mass in the College Auditorium next Wednesday morning. All the students of the college will attend. The Mass will be celebrated by



Msgr. Randall Shannon, chaplain and head of the Department of Religion, and the sermon will be delivered by Very Rev. Msgr. John S. Randall, diocesan director of the Propagation of the Faith.

Typic daily in the Oratory during the following eight days students will assemble for prayer for the Octave intentions.

The Chair of Unity Octave, which continues during the period from the Feast of St. Peter's Chair at Rome to the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, is sponsored by the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement at Graymoor, Garrison, N. Y. formerly
