Weekly Corporate Reservations Deadline Communion For Nears On Holy Year Tour UR Newman Club

A surge of new reservations made this week for the 1934 Diocesan Pilgrimage to Rome under the direction of the Very Rev. Msgr. James C. McAniff, Chancellor of the Diocese, indicates growing interest in the eventual 28-day trip.

The Newman Club of the University of Rochester started a program of weekly corporate Communion, Sunday, Jan. 15. The group attended 10 o'clock Mass at Corpus Christi Church in a body and received Holy Communion. After Mass a Communion breakfast was held at the Hotel Seneca under the auspices of the Club Chaplain, the Rev. Paul Tufts.

THE NEWMAN CLUB adopted the idea of weekly Communion and Breakfast at its last meeting where the "spiritual benefits accruing from corporate Communion" were stressed. Father Tufts also announced that he will be on the University campuses two days a week to provide guidance for Catholic students.

This year, the U. of R. Newmanites are publishing the Provincial Bulletin. This monthly news letter, distributed to Newman Clubs in Western New York State colleges, is edited by Bob Schwand. The campus Catholic publication is under the direction of Dan O'Dell.

2 New Courses Set At Nazareth For Adult Study

Sister Rose Angela, dean of Nazareth College, announces two new courses offered in the Adult Education Program for the second semester, which begins on Jan. 31.

Andrew E. Knaut, a local attorney, who received both his B.A. and M.A. from Canisius College, Buffalo, will teach a survey course in law, touching on those phases of the law which affect the average individual.

THIS SERIES of lectures will cover the law of contracts, the law pertaining to wills and estates, laws affecting real and personal property with special emphasis on the timely subject of Federal and State taxation. The course is not designed for those who are professionally engaged in the practice of law or in business but for the layman who meets legal problems of this kind in everyday life.

A course in the economics of labor will be offered, stressing Christian principles as they affect employer and employee, as outlined in the papal encyclicals.

The Sociology Department will offer a course in General Sociology, which is a branch of the social sciences.

Father Caffery Named Monsignor

The Rev. G. Walter Caffery, of El Paso, Tex., a former Rochesterian and son of George Caffery, 58 Rugby Ave., has been elevated to the rank of Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor by His Holiness Pope Pius XII, according to word received here.

Monsignor Caffery who is rector of St. Patrick's Cathedral, El Paso, is a brother of Mrs. John Gagan and Miss Della Caffery of 58 Rugby Ave.

He attended St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries and was ordained by the Most Rev. Anthony J. Schuler, S.J., for the Diocese of El Paso, Dec. 20, 1925.

He is to be invested in El Paso Jan. 29.

Work Starts On Buildings In New St. Cecilia Parish

Construction of the first buildings of St. Cecilia's Parish, Irondequoit, to cost an estimated \$185,000, will commence immediately at the corner of Culver Road and Bröwer Road, according to the Rev. Bernard Newcomb, pastor.

Architect Edward M. Lorschelder announced this week awarding of contracts as follows: General Contractors, S. P. Vassie and Son Inc.; plumbing, A. Burgart; electrical work, Dwyer Electric Co. Inc.

Church and school to be built first will have an exterior of faced brick with stone trim. The church will have a seating capacity of 320 persons, and a parish hall with kitchen and storage rooms will be included under the church.

The school will consist of eight classrooms and a kindergarten and will have a capacity of approximately 450 pupils. The buildings will be heated through-out by oil.

Plans are to have the church ready for use in late Spring or early Summer. The school is being planned to be in readiness by the opening of the new term in September.

An old farmhouse on the 7-acre property is being remedied for a rectory. Ample space for off-street parking is being provided on the property. The church will face on Culver Road, and the school on Bröwer Road.

Provision will be made for future church construction, and for a convent. Father Newcomb stated.

The work will be in charge of Father Newcomb. Trustees of the new parish are George B. McAvoy and Edmund J. Costich.

St. Lucy Parishioners To Honor New Monsignor

Parishioners of St. Lucy's Parish will celebrate the recent elevation of their pastor, the Very Reverend Monsignor Benedict J. Maselli, to the rank of Fiscal Chamberlain by Pope Pius XII with a public reception to be held in the parish hall, 253 Troup Street, Sunday afternoon, Jan. 21, from 2 to 4 p.m.

Monsignor Maselli, who has been pastor of St. Lucy's since 1927, received his fiscal chamberlain rank through the Holy See, Rome, Italy, by the Pope's Chamberlain in a letter of the Diocese of Trentino, Italy, who was issued to the Diocese of Rochester to give for the faithful news.

A native of Italy, he became a citizen of the United States on Sept. 30, 1920. He was ordained July 12, 1918 at Chieti by Bishop DeLuca after studying at the Regional Seminary of Frosinone, Italy.

During the first World War Monsignor Maselli served as a military chaplain with the Italian Army.
