Red Cross Charts Fund Campaign To Open March 1

The Rochester Chapter American Red Cross and its 20 branches will conduct its annual fund drive, March 1-15, Paul Miller, chairman of the fund drive, announced today.

March is the designated month for the National Red Cross Fund Drive. The national collection this year will be 67 million dollars. The Rochester and Monroe County will be \$298,020, a slight decrease from the amount collected in 1939.

Miller at this time also announced that the organization of the drive had been completed and the following chairmen had been appointed:

"Right now is a good time to begin thinking about the drive, getting ready for it, because right now the Red Cross is so much in evidence by its good works," Chairman Miller said. "We see and hear everyday what it is doing for people who really need help."

KC Fellowship Awards To Catholic U. Set In April

Details concerning academic and character requisites and application blanks can be obtained by writing the Secretary General, Chairman, Committee on Scholarships and Fellowships, Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C. Other consideration being given to preference shall be given to members or sons of members of the Knights of Columbus.

Knights of Columbus fellowships are entitled to board, lodging and tuition, but must pay all fees. The fellowships at the Catholic University are for graduate work only and no undergraduate fellowships are offered. Awards will be announced in April.
