Young people crossing the Atlantic during this Holy Year are invited to make Laetare, at Lillithgow, Scotland, a port of call by the Rev. M. J. McGovern writing to the Catholic Courier Journal from the Youth Holiday Camp.

Laetare is unique in the Catholic world and is a Catholic center operated "to develop a sense of mutual understanding between peoples of different countries."

Located near Edinburgh and 30 miles from Glasgow, the holiday home is designed for young people over 14 years of age.

On the grounds are two houses, one for boys and the other for girls, with lounge, and library, a large hall for dancing, games and film shows, a tennis court, putting green, sports field and facilities for swimming.

Prominent on the grounds is St. Michael's Church on the lawn of which is Calvary with figures of bronze.

The rule of the place, says Father McGovern, is the ancient rule of loving God without any fuss or demonstration. There is no regimentation.

Ex-Prisoner of War Benefits Available

The Rochester Chapter, American Red Cross, now has application forms available for living Ex-Prisoner of War benefits.

The War Claims Commission is now operating in Washington, D.C. to receive claims for Ex-Prisoner of War benefits under Public Law 896, 80th Congress. Compensation is payable at the rate of \$100 for each day of confinement during which the enemy government failed to furnish the quality and quantity of food required by the terms of the Geneva Convention.

The American National Red Cross has been accredited to represent claimants before the Commission and is available to assist without charge in the preparation and filing of this form.

Any desiring to file a claim are asked to stop in at the Red Cross office, Home Service Department, 150 Spring Street, with original or copy of discharge. Office hours are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily and from 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday.

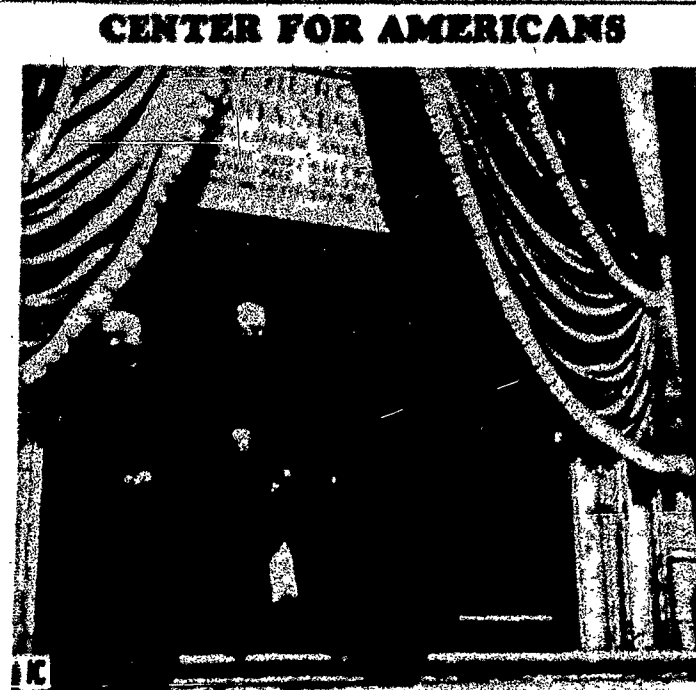

Reds Smear Harlem To Discredit U. S., Says Negro

New York (NC) Harlem has been the victim of a communists smear campaign designed to discredit the United States in the eyes of other nations. It was charged by George S. Schuyler, Negro journalist in an address before the Catholic Interracial Forum.

MR. SCHUYLER, columnist for the Pittsburgh Courier world's largest Negro newspaper, and a resident of Harlem for the last 30 years said the campaign started in 1928, the year of the Third Internationale and now has grown to such proportions that it threatens the Marshall Plan European recovery and democracy in general.

He declared that although Harlem has made enormous strides in improved living conditions, housing, educational and recreational facilities it is practically impossible to get a newspaper or pictorial publication to present a true picture of the conditions, "where Negroes can hold up their heads, have the ballot and obtain positions of dignity as teachers and civic leaders or success in a thousand and one business enterprises."

THE COLUMNIST declared that contrary to general opinion, Harlem is not overcrowded. He said there are some 100,000 less residents in the section than in 1910. In contrast Mr. Schuyler stated that Harlem today has a population of 211 persons per acre compared with 224 persons per acre in New York's midtown east side.

He said Harlem has some 5,000 Negro owned and operated businesses, some 50,000 Negro labor union members and a total population of between 450,000 and 500,000 Negroes. He claimed that Harlem today has a higher percentage of church attendance than anywhere else in New York, and less crime and delinquency than at any time in the past.

Father Gannon Leaves Feb. 1 On Japan Tour

Montour Falls, Rev. David Gannon S.A. named procurator of the Society of the Atonement Missions throughout the world will leave Montour Falls Feb. 1 to take up his new duties. Father Gannon was appointed by the Very Rev. Angelus Delunt S.A. Father General of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement at Graymoor, Garrison N.Y. following his work in establishing the new St. John's Atonement Seminary here.

In his new post Father Gannon will accompany party Father Delahunt on an inspection tour of the Society's missions in the diocese of Tokyo and Yokohama in Japan. For the past year Father Gannon has supervised the reconstruction and remodeling of the former Cook Academy into a seminary for his Society at a cost estimated at more than \$1,000,000.

Catholic Paper Cautions On Dangers In Protestant Unity

New York (RNS) — Concern that union among Protestant denominations "may progress at the price of attaching less and less importance to essential Christian doctrines" was voiced in an editorial published here by the American national Roman Catholic weekly. The Catholic weekly observed that a united Protestantism would "lessen to a notable degree the scandal of over 200 divided sects."

THE CATHOLIC publication's warning came in an editorial commenting on the recent Green with Conf. meeting of Protestant churchmen at which a permanent Conference on Church Union was established. America said that if devout Protestants felt thus betrayed their "search for stability and devotion to principle" might see them turn to "the Christ given unity of His one, true Church"—the Roman Catholic Church. "OUR PRAYERS," the editor-

ial added, "might well be directed to the intention that Protestant leaders will not sacrifice inner truths for outward cohesion."
