### Father Nastvogel, Former Rector At St. Joseph's, Dies

The Rev. Frederick Nastvogel, C.S.S.R., who served six years as rector of St. Joseph's Church, Rochester in the 1930's, died Jan. 9, 1950 at St. Clement's College, Saratoga Springs.

Father Nastvogel, a native of Baltimore, was a Redemptorist for 43 years. Mass of Requiem for repose of his soul was offered at Saratoga Springs, Jan. 12.

Highly esteemed here, Father Nastvogel was born March 16, 1887. He was educated at St. James Parochial School and entered St. Mary's Redemptorist Preparatory College at North East, Pa.

HE MADE HIS Novitiate at St. Mary's College, Hichester, Md. and was professed a Redemptorist on Aug. 2, 1907. He made his theological studies at Mt. St. Alphonsus Seminary Exopus and was ordained at Exopus on June 30, 1912.

Following his ordination he served for a short time in Puerto Rico and New York City. For 16 years he was a professor at St. Mary's College, North East, Pa.

After serving at St. Joseph's here he served for six years as rector of St. Peter's Church, Philadelphia and in 1945 was sent to St. Michael's Church, Baltimore. Because of ill health he was sent after about two years to Saratoga Springs.

He is survived by his mother Mrs. Margaret Nastvogel of Baltimore; two brothers, John and Lawrence Nastvogel and three sisters Mrs. Marie Blumenauer, Mrs. Martha McCormick and Mrs. Louise Williams. Another sister, Sister Mary Annette died some years ago as a novice in the Franciscan convent at Glen Ridge, Pa.

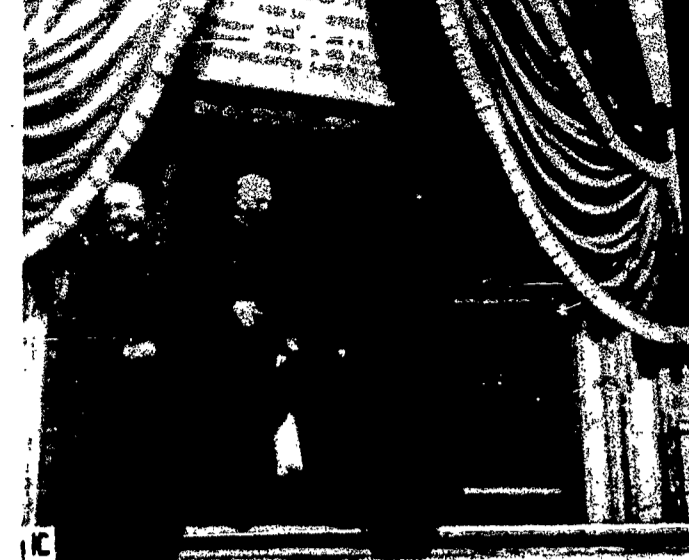
