The church members will give blood in the Church Hall between 3 and 7 p. m., and it is hoped more than 50 donations will be made.

Donald E. McConville, program chairman, said the program is counting on the public spirited parish to make its quota. "To supply the blood program with the 30,000 pints of blood needed this year, we must put out every effort to make the quota each and every day."

"BLOOD - transfusions," he pointed out, "are paying tremendous dividends in terms of lives saved and convalescences speeded. For the blood which is accomplishing astonishing medical gains the Red Cross receives not a cent in payment. "All the program asks," McConville said, "is that the people of the area will continue to give their blood to aid their ill and injured fellow citizens."

"All healthy adults," he said, "should consider it their civic duty to give blood at least twice a year. There are few things," he said, "that equal the feeling you get in giving blood and knowing that you may save the life of another human being."

In charge of preparations for the bloodmobile visit to the church is Eric Smith. The Rev. Francis Pegram, assistant pastor, is helping with arrangements.
