

St. Bona President To Be Greeted By Alumni

Very Rev. Juvenal Lator, O. F. M., 12th president of St. Bonaventure College will visit Rochester Friday Feb. 3 to meet with the Alumni and Ladies Auxiliary at the Rochester Chapter. He will be guest of honor at the monthly meeting of the Alumni at evening at Columbus Civic Center at 8:30 p.m.

Father Juvenal was named to the position July, 1939, succeeding Very Rev. Thomas Plasmann, O. F. M. The appointment followed closely on the heels of the death of Very Rev. Thomas Plasmann, O. F. M., a provincial of the Holy Name Province of Friars Minor.

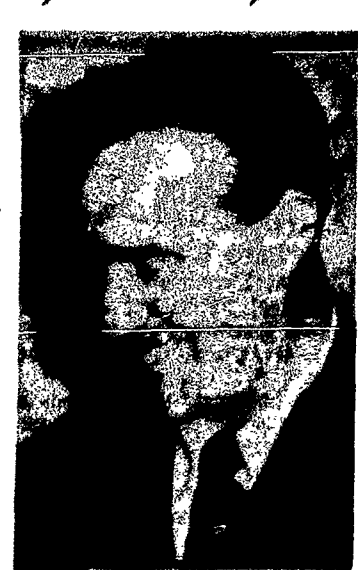
The new president was born 26 years ago at Brooklyn, where his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Lator, still reside. He is believed to be the second youngest president ever appointed to the College.

A graduate of St. John's Prep in Brooklyn, he attended St. Joseph's Seminary at Columbus, N. Y. In June, 1933, received his bachelor of arts degree from St. Bonaventure College and four years later on June 9, 1936 he was ordained. In 1937, Father Juvenal joined the faculty of St. Joseph's Seminary, at the time taking up the duties as prefect of discipline there. He went to St. Bonaventure the following year to teach English at the College and philosophy at Christ the King Seminary.

Father Juvenal received the master of arts degree from the University of Toronto in 1941, attending the Pontifical Institute of Medieval Studies at the same time. Laval University in Quebec conferred on him the degree of doctor of philosophy in 1943. On Father Juvenal's return to St. Bonaventure College in the same year, he was appointed spiritual director of the Seminary and professor of Philosophy. He was named head of the Department of Philosophy at the College in 1946.

(Continued from Page 1) Suicidal and homicide are against criminal law in all states and in practically all civilized countries. Woods further noted that mercy killing proposals include a stipulation that the consent of the "incurable" must be obtained before death could be administered. "I doubt that a patient in such extremities of pain would be capable or legally competent to give such consent," the lawyer declared.

Criticizing "a local newspaper which defended the idea of having juries decide euthanasia cases," Woods stated: "Imagine trusting your life to a jury in Germany or Russia. The time may come when such kind of juries may exist in our own country, unless as members of the Holy Name Society we express and expound correct principles, and thwart any attempt by our 'modern liberals' to enact any such so-called law as euthanasia."

Deanery delegates adopted a resolution requesting Congressmen representing this area to vote against Federal Aid to Schools legislation which would preclude benefits to all American children, whether in public or non public schools.
