4th Degree K. C. Invite City To Fr. Keller Talk

While 5,000 invitations are going out for the open public lecture by the Rev. James M. Keller, M.M., founder of the Christopher Movement in Columbus Civic Center, Wednesday, Feb. 13 at 8 p.m., anyone interested is asked to come to the lecture.

This announcement is made by Charles A. Tucker, general chairman of the golden jubilee observance of Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus.

His Excellency Bishop Kearney will preside at the lecture and present Father Keller.

THE FOUNDER of the Christopher Movement is a member of the Catholic Foreign Mission Society of Maryknoll. He has written several books, among them "You Can Change the World," "Three Minutes a Day," and "Men of Maryknoll."

He started the Christopher Movement in 1945. At the time he said he was convinced that 10 per cent of humanity was causing most of the world's real major troubles because of their militant hatred of things Christian and Christ-like, then he could develop in another per cent a sense of responsibility and initiative in bringing back into the marketplace, the factory and the school, and the home the major truths which guarantee peace for all mankind.

Although under Catholic auspices, the Christopher Movement invites people of all faiths to participate. The same is true of the coming lecture according to Chairman Tucker.

The golden jubilee observance will open with the annual formal Lincoln Day dinner and ball at the Sheraton on Sunday, Feb. 12 at 6:30 p.m. Bishop Kearney will be guest of honor and Henry L. Melinger of the Brooklyn public school staff will be principal lay speaker.

Closing event will be a dance in the K. of C. clubrooms, Saturday, Feb. 18 at 9 p.m.

Catholic Press Rating High, Editor Tells Waverly HNS

Waverly — "The greatness of the Catholic Press lies in the fact that again and again it has been right when the world was wrong."

Thus declared the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, editor of the Catholic Courier Journal speaking at the first Holy Name Society of St. James Church to be held in the newly established parish hall.

The guest speaker was presented by the Rev. Robert J. Fox, pastor who also said that he would not be satisfied until every man in the parish was a practical member of the Holy Name Society. He urged those present to take it upon themselves to increase their membership.

CATHOLIC journalists, Father Flynn said in the principal address, have had the consistent courage to defend the truth when the truth was not very popular.

"We were not very popular when we questioned the wartime propaganda of 'Russian democracy' but the Red Terror regime now ruling in China and Eastern European countries proves that we were right when it was very popular to be wrong."

"Although the Catholic newspaper lacks the glamor of the secular press," Father Flynn said, "there is a better sense of values in the pages of the Catholic press."
