Representatives of Holy Name Societies and men of organizations from all parishes in Monroe County have been urged to attend a special meeting at 8 p.m. Monday, Feb. 27, in the Knights of Columbus clubrooms to organize committees for the play, 'City of Kings'.

Written by the Rev. Urban Nagle, O.P., who also authored 'Lady of Fatima', the play deals with the life of Blessed Martin de Porras, Negro Dominican Brother. It won third prize in the national Chlophor drama contest and had 76 performances in the Blackfriar Theater in New York City.

Opening rehearsals were begun this week. Besides night evening performances during Passion Week, there will be four weekend matinees for school children. Tickets for the play, priced at \$1.20 general admission and 60 cents additional for reserved seats, will be distributed to all Monroe County parishes next week.

All Holy Name Societies in Monroe County were asked this week by the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, spiritual director of the Rochester Diocese Holy Name Union, to be represented at the special meeting Monday night to secure all information as to operation of ticket distribution and other phases of the production.

This year's ticket system will avoid complications involved with exchanges. General admission tickets for 'City of Kings' will be good for any night of the performance on a first come first served basis, and will not have to be exchanged. Reservations however, will require exchange or may be made directly through the Holy Name Office, 350 St. Patrick's Church.

Catholic Unionists Draft Constitution

The newly formed Federation of Roman Catholic Trade Unionists of Great Britain has circulated a draft of its proposed constitution among diocesan trade union associations for their approval. According to the charter, the aims of the federation are substantially the same as those of the diocesan groups, namely, to encourage Catholic workers to join trade unions and to defend Catholic principles when they are attacked in trade union bodies.

The federation, which was formed in Glasgow, is expected to have a membership of 12,000, composed of Catholic workers in unions affiliated with the Trade Union Council of Great Britain. This figure corresponds roughly to that of the combined membership of the diocesan associations.
