### 'Moonlight' Comes to Nazareth College; A Student All the Way From Indo-China

Nazareth College has its own "Moonlight" now, a charming little Indo-Chinese girl whose real name, Phan Thi Nguyen Minh, literally translated means "moonlight" or "brilliant moon."

The daughter of a government official of Saigon, Moonlight slipped quietly into Rochester a week ago after a delayed passage from France and was enrolled as Pauline Minh in the Nazareth College sophomore class.

"Phan" is Pauline's family name, her father being Monsieur Phan van Can, a health official in Saigon. "Thi" is a name given to all girls in her native country and "Nguyet Minh" is moonlight.

Globalizing is hardly new to 21-year-old Pauline who started her travels over a year ago when she crossed the world to Paris to study in an Ursuline convent school, the Institut de Notre Dame, Saint Germain-Laye.

**HELD UP** BY a dockyard strike she completed the last lap of her journey Feb. 16 when she arrived in New York aboard the liner Ile de France. Accompanying her was another Indo-Chinese student, a young man named Ly-Chanh Duc, "Virtue," who went on to Seton Hall College, South Orange, N. J.

Both students came to Amherst colleges through arrangements made by Father Emmanuel Jacques, a Belgian priest who is attached to the Vicariate Apostolic of Phat Diem in Tonkin province of the new republic of Indo-China.

Now in Chicago, Father Jacques has been in America getting scholarships for Indo-Chinese students to help increase the native lay and clerical apostolate in Vietnam (pronounced roughly like "Wienna" with an "m").

Although a non-Catholic, Pauline Minh has been tutored in Catholic schools for seven of her ten years of study in her own country, she studied under Canonesses of St. Augustine at Notre Dame Duong Bien in Dai Lai, Vietnam. Her parents practice Confucianism, the ancient religion of the famed Chinese philosopher, as do most Vietnamese who have not been converted by the Catholic missionaries.

Pauline who spent a pleasant couple of days in the home of a French born in Allendale, N. J. was met by Betty Keegan and Libby Murphy, two Nazareth alumnae now living in New York, who showed her around the town. The Vietnamese girl enjoyed a movie at Radio City

Music Hall and took in the bright lights of Broadway.

**PAULINE** HAS the delicate features of the oriental woman, but she speaks careful English with a slightly French accent. She loves the French language and likes English, but isn't sure what she learned in France is the same thing that passes for English in this country.

Besides their decidedly un-British English, another thing Pauline has noticed about Americans is their friendly hospitality or as she describes it "the family spirit." She won't

be able to go home for five years because of the distance, and the expense involved.

In the meantime she keeps touch through letters which take a week to go to Saigon where there is a clash between Communist elements and the present democratic government of Vietnam. She says the impact of the trouble is not felt so much in Saigon as it is in the rural areas of the country, where the Communists are in strength. Pauline is studying sociology at Nazareth College, with a view to going into social work.
