

KC Unit Asks Firms To Close On Good Friday

To foster a greater reverence and Christian observance of Good Friday, Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus is again launching a movement to encourage places of business to close at least between the hours of 12 to 3 on April 7.

This is announced today by Donald E. Woerner, chairman of the Assembly's Good Friday committee.

The six knights are sending out a call to all members of the Knights of Columbus in Rochester Council soliciting their support in the movement and a financial donation to help defray expenses.

COOPERATION OF members of Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Women is being asked through

the Rev. Albert J. Shamon who is faithful heir of the knight's organization and moderator of the women's group which embraces all Catholic women's societies.

Every means of informing the public of the movement will be used according to Chairman Woerner. Pastors will be requested to announce the project in their bulletins and from the pulpit where possible.

All Christian groups will be asked to join in the movement, Chairman Woerner said.

Attractive window stickers are being prepared to put in the stores and business houses co-operating. The committee plans by means of newspaper advertising to list the names of those firms cooperating in the movement.

The Fourth Degree unit in Rochester launched the movement a few years ago and reports progress each year as the idea is explained.

Funeral of Walter L. Gordinier, 62 retired city fireman who died March 2, 1950, were held Monday morning, March 6, 1950, from the L. W. Maler's Sons Funeral Home, Clinton Ave. No. 1, and in Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church.

Requiem Mass was offered by the Rev. Frank J. Hoelen. Bearers were members of the Firemen's Holy Name Society. Members of the Moose were honorary bearers. Father Hoelen gave the final blessing at the grave in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Mr. Gordinier worked as a toolmaker here and in Detroit, Michigan, before he was appointed to the Fire Department in April, 1920. He served 22 years as a fireman at Engine Company 2 in Clinton Avenue North and at 24 in Ridge Road West. During World War II, he worked at Eastman Kodak Company's Hawk-Eye Works.

He was a member of the Rochester Lodge of Moose, the Firemen's Benevolent Association and the Firemen's Holy Name Society.

Besides his widow, Philippine Leimbinger Gordinier, he leaves two sons, Walter and Charles; two daughters, Eileen and Beatrice and three brothers, James, William, a member of the Rochester Fire Department, and Raymond Gordinier, former Major League baseball pitcher.

Otto Of Austria Slated In Culture Series Mar. 26

His Imperial Highness Otto of Austria will speak on "Today's Christian Europe," in the Aquinas Christian Culture Series on Sunday, March 26 at 8:15 p.m. in Aquinas Auditorium according to the Rev. Alphons J. Malone, C.S.B., director.

Otto of Austria, a graduate of the University of Louvain, Belgium and possessor of a Doctor of Political Sciences degree, he is said to be a keen student of contemporary affairs.

SINCE JULY, 1940 he has spent much time in America with residence in Washington where he has worked with other leaders of Central Europe in the common cause of the United Nations.

Otto of Austria, since the early part of the 1920's has devoted much time to the active study of the evolution, revolutionary tactics and doctrines of the Communist movement.

Because of his activities he has become a target for the Russian press, especially the Red Army papers, as well as the Communist papers of Europe which are bitterly attacking him almost daily.

During the early stages of Hitler's conquest, Otto of Austria from France invited his people to continue the fight against Hitler by underground methods. He was later tried in absentia by a German court and condemned to death on charges of organizing underground revolutionary groups in Austria against Hitler and Germany.

Born on Nov. 20, 1912 in Reichau, Province of lower Austria, Austria-Hungary, his father was Charles, Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary and his mother Empress Zita, born Princess of Bourbon. Emperor Francis Joseph was his great-grand-uncle.

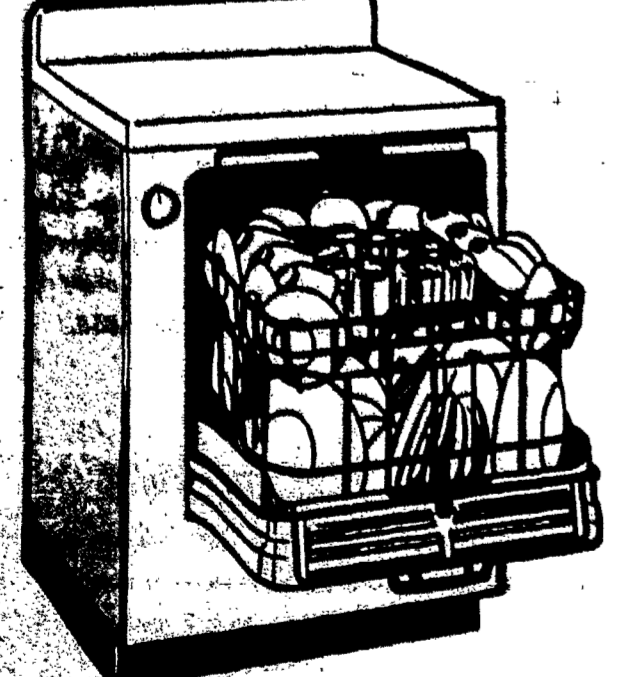
