**NCCW Unit Hears Marriage Advice From Priest, Doctor**

Marriage may be a 50-50 proposition in theory, but the wife, being more adaptable, should go over the "fifty-yard line," according to Dr. Leo LaPalm, Rochester physician who gave an instruction Monday evening at the pre-marriage course in the Empire Room of Powers Hotel.  
 Doctor LaPalm shared the platform with the Rev. John McCafferty, assistant director, Rochester Catholic Charities Family Division at the third Pre-Cana conference sponsored by Rochester Diocese Council National Council of Catholic Women. The physician's topic was "Love and the Mind."  
 Pointing out physical and emotional differences between the sexes, Doctor LaPalm said "The most important thing in marriage is mutual understanding. The partners must realize there is a difference, therefore they should sit down and study these differences."  
 BOTH MALE and female are logical beings, he said, but differ in grasping truth. The male is endowed with more reasoning ability, female with more intuition. Another intellectual point of difference the speaker cited was the female judgment is hasty and she judges according to likes and dislikes, whereas the male foresees every possibility before making a decision.  
 "Conjugal love must be considered sacred," said Doctor LaPalm. "The male and female should love wholeheartedly. He reminded the couples of the emotional differences between the two sexes one of the most important of which is that the male wants to take the initiative, seeks to love instead of being loved while the female is the partner who wants to be chased and conquered."  
 He advised discussion to iron out differences of opinion, frequent reception of the sacraments, and practice of the beatitudes.  
 FATHER McCAFFERTY discussed the Church's regulations on marriage. "Marriage," he asserted, "is not to be ruled by caprice. Marriage is a contract and a sacrament which cannot be separated."  
 He reviewed the procedure for Catholic marriage appearing before the pastor to announce intention, publication of the banns, identification papers and certificate of baptism not over 6 months old.

**Work To Start On \$141,647 Building For DeSales High School, Geneva**

Geneva Building will start the Rochester Diocese, plans immediately on an addition to the DeSales High School following the awarding of bids on the work Saturday. The project will cost \$141,647.  
 Announcement of the awarding of the contract was made Monday by Rt. Rev. Msgr. William H. McFadden, V.F. of St. Stephen's church and Rev. Edward K. Ball, of St. Francis de Sales church. The high school is operated jointly by both parishes.  
 Contract for the new addition was awarded by the Diocesan building committee of Rochester to Brown and Hoyt of Canaan, N.Y.  
 The new structure will replace the Pulteney St. wing of the building which was completely destroyed by fire March 21, 1948.  
 Electrical contract was let to Dayer Electric Co., Rochester, and heating contract was made to Hoban and White. Penn Yan Plumbing will be done by Rigan and Jensen of Geneva.  
 Report of the saving of the contract and bids was made following a meeting on Saturday with architect Joseph P. Flynn of Rochester and Monsignor McFadden and Father Ball in St. Stephen's rectory.  
 Plans for the center plant building program was made on Nov. 2, 1949. That bids on the building project were received and the revised it was said that an bids were higher than had been expected.  
 In addition to the building will be four class rooms, a library and a laboratory. There will also be a lunch room and showers in the basement.  
 St. Francis de Sales high school was opened in Sept. 1912. It was admitted to the University of the State of New York by the Board of Regents and in January 1914 the first Regent examination were held.  
 The 1948-49 high school was conducted in St. Francis de Sales school on Exchange St. Need for expansion of both elementary and high school called for larger quarters for both institutions, and in 1923, at the suggestion of the late Bishop John O'Brien of
