Holy Redeemer Society Maps Card Party In Hall, April 14

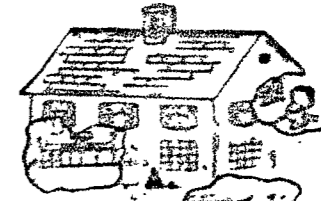

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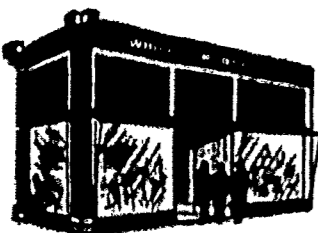
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Hospital Staffs' Cut Hit By CWV

Monroe County Chapter, Catholic War Veterans has gone on record protesting the Federal economy measures requiring Veterans Hospital staffs and has instituted a study of the situation at Canandaigua Hospital.

This was announced by Armand L. LaMay, County Commander of the CWV following the sending of a telegram to Senators Herbert H. Lehman and Irving M. Ives and Representatives Kenneth B. Keating and James W. Wadsworth.

"Since ordered reduction of Veterans Administration hospital personnel will seriously hamper the proper care of hospitalized veterans of our wars, Monroe County chapter, Catholic War Veterans, strongly urges you to use every means at your command to secure additional funds to maintain present veterans hospital staffs."

LaMay said similar actions has been taken by state and national officers of CWV.

Aquinas Students Reenact Signing of Declaration

Signing of the Declaration of Independence was faithfully reenacted by the History Club at Aquinas Institute, March 16 in an hour-long assembly for the student body.

With student players dressed in costumes of 174 years ago, event by event of the historic signing which took place in the State House at Philadelphia July 4, 1776, passed in review. The show was considered a tribute to the history club members, Rev. Arthur Looch, C.S.B.

TO MAKE the production more realistic, the boys had received from the Columbia Broadcasting System, donation of a script from a recent "CBS in Three" program. Project Chairman Frank Doyle assisted by Krag Donovan and Robert Snow proceeded to adapt this basic program to the play's needs.

The stage was set as a colonial meeting hall with the exception that CBS news commentator John Daly was present in the person of Mike Mazza of the Aquinas Club to report the events transpiring.

EXCEPT FOR news introductions and radio reports at strategic points the program was exactly reproduced with factual dialogue used. Preceding over the convention was John Hancock, played by Larry Kingovan. Next came the colonial leaders including Thomas Jefferson with Philip Bacon by the name John Adams, crush Cline and John Dickinson. Charles S. Sabach moved about in the convention as they did in 1776. Offstage Ned Carnes played by Gerry LeBlanc interpreted

the British General Howe (Pat Heffernan) and General George Washington (Earl Jerome) fighting in the room was interviewed on the parade ground in New York by Bud Colver (Bill Reverell). climax came in the actual signing of the historic document. As clerk (Bob Farrell) called the roll of states delegates advanced and declared their views on independence at any price. Efforts of the players drew prolonged applause from faculty members and students.

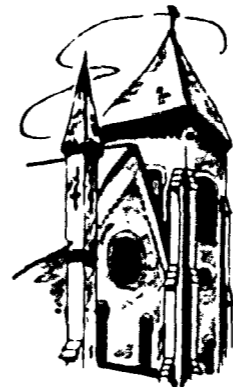
Aquinas Seniors On WHEC Sunday
