

**U. S. Pilgrim Gets Pope's Zucchetto**  
 Rome (AP)—Three years ago His Holiness Pope Pius XII gave his own red hat to His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, when the latter was elevated to the cardinalate. This week His Holiness gave

a member of the New York pilgrimage led by Cardinal Spellman his own little white skull cap, or zucchetto. The proud owner of the prized souvenir is George Gillespie, 85-year-old New York lawyer and St. Vincent de Paul Society leader.

Having brought a zucchetto, Mr. Gillespie asked the Pope to bless it when the pilgrimage was received in audience. The Holy Father took off his own zucchetto and said: "You take mine and I'll take yours." The Pope then put the new zucchetto on his head.

**KC Boy Leader Course Slated at LeMoyne College**

One of a series of twelve Summer Schools of Boy Leadership to be conducted this year at leading colleges and universities throughout the United States and Canada will be held at LeMoyne College in Syracuse on the weekend of July 21-22 according to John J. Conway, executive director of the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council Boy Life Bureau.

The practical training in youth leadership is open to the members of the Reverend (Clergy) parish CYO workers, Scout leaders, Columbian Squares Counselors and those laymen who have interested themselves in the leisure time guidance of youth.

The Summer School sessions will be conducted by the professionally trained staff of the Knights of Columbus Boy Life Bureau and the weekend program will feature formal lectures, discussions, and actual demonstrations of the principles and methods of youth leadership.

TOPICS TO BE COVERED during the course include: The Nature and Characteristics of the Adolescent Boy; The Elements of a Program; Program Planning, Business and Finance of a Youth Organization; Dramatics, Camping, Publicity, etc.

Classes will be held at LeMoyne College and the partial meals will take their meals in the college cafeteria. Housing arrangements for the out of town participants will be handled by the Syracuse Council, Knights of Columbus under the direction of George W. Varney, Executive Secretary, Syracuse Council. It is estimated that the total cost of the week end training course will not exceed \$15.00 for each participant. This figure would cover lodging, meals, registration and tuition.

The registration and tuition fee of \$10.00 for each student will be payable to the College. The opening session of the Summer School is scheduled for Friday evening (July 21) at 8 p.m. and the closing exercises will be held on Sunday afternoon (July 23) at 3 p.m.

**New Holy Year Tour Sailing Aug. 1 Listed**
