**Statue Buried During War Now Stands In Irish Town**

Dublin — (NU)— An 18 foot, three and a half-ton bronze statue of Christ the King which spent the war years buried in France, has just been delivered to the town of Dún Laoghaire Port of Dublin to be erected there facing the sea.

Cast in Paris some 10 years ago just as the war began, the statue was buried on a French farm by a famous bronze founder and covered by a haystack. Thus hidden for six years and the German occupation occupied Paris.

THESE IN A bit of interesting history connected with the statue travels

Shortly after the late Pope Pius XI issued the encyclical proclaiming the Kingship of Christ and instituting the Feast of Christ the King, many parishes throughout the country erected statues of Christ the King in public places.

In 1931, a committee of interested people was formed in Dún Laoghaire and a fund started for the building and erection of a statue of Christ the King. The late Andrew O'Connor, a famous Irish-American sculptor, then in Paris, returned to Ireland and arranged to construct the plaster cast from which the finished bronze statue would be made. The finished cast was sent to France where it was cast in bronze.

THEN CAME the war to cause the secret hiding of the statue till it could be finished and sent to Dublin.

The statue is a three-sided monument depicting Christ the King, Christ the Consoler and Christ in Desolation. It is so designed that only one side can be seen completely at a time.


**Easter Rosary Program Planned on Radio and TV**


