Christopher Talk Changes Views of 7 College Seniors

This story goes back three years to Rochester, N. Y. and seven men who were about to graduate from college according to an NCWC News Service dispatch from New York city. Father James M. Keller, M.M. who tells the story, came to town and gave a talk on the Christopher movement, which he founded to promote Christian ideals in all walks of life. One of the seven men dropped into Father Keller's headquarters here not long ago and told him how the story ends.

UNTIL THEY listened to Father Keller's talk, the seven had made up their minds to "fall into" the first job that promised material security after graduation. They had no particular ideals for a career. After hearing the Christopher movement put across the idea of a career with a purpose, they changed their minds. One of the seven now is on his way to become a newspaper writer, two are teaching in high school, two others are studying for doctorates in preparation for teaching in college and the other two are students for the present.
