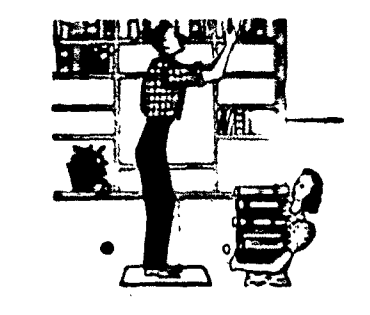
Girls between the ages of eight and thirteen are urged to register now for Camp Villa Maria, on Harris Hill, if they want to be among the first 100 to be accepted.

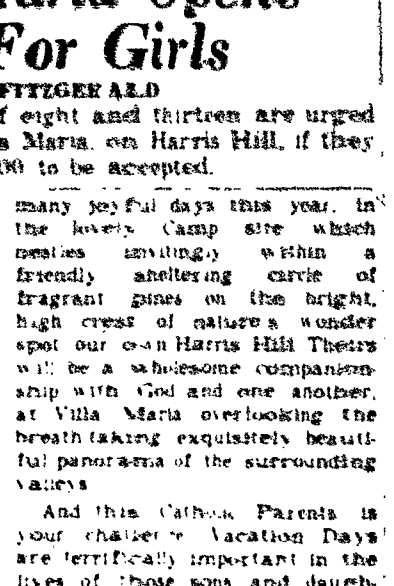
