The cross was set up temporarily in a rock grotto originally erected in honor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help on Maplewood Drive at the park by her daughter, Mrs. Arlene Schwalb, "for favors received."

A painstaking job of construction was done by Frank Aspenleiter, Mrs. Schwalb's cousin who spent five months building the grotto between two rock gardens, and setting out a flag stone walk. Mr. Aspenleiter hauled rock from LeRoy for the job. He began work on the shrine in June and completed it in October.

SINCE A STATUE of Our Lady of Perpetual Help was unavailable, a 30-inch Carrara marble statue of Our Lady of Lourdes, imported from Italy, was set up in the niche. Above it hangs a reproduction of the miraculous picture of the Mother of Perpetual Help. For Good Friday, a curtain was drawn over the statue, and the crucifix was placed in front of it. Vigil lights are burned constantly at the shrine and at night, flood lights, set in the rock garden, focus attention on the grotto.

Mrs. Schwalb reveals that in addition to personal favors which she attributes to the Mother of Perpetual Help, several people who visit the shrine have reported receiving answers to prayers said at the grotto. Several Kodak workers are regular visitors and many people driving by in automobiles stop to say a prayer Sunday night, said Mrs. Schwalb, she was impressed by the sight of a family of father, mother and 3 children, kneeling before the shrine.
