

Msgr. O'Beirne, Native of Rochester, Dies In Texas

Funeral services for the Very Rev. Msgr. Patrick J. F. O'Beirne, 71, Rochester-born priest of the Dallas, Texas Diocese, were held Wednesday, Mar. 20, 1950, in the chapel of St. Paul's Hospital, Dallas, where he died Saturday evening, March 25, 1950, of a heart attack.

The Most Rev. Joseph P. Lynch, Bishop of Dallas, presided at the Requiem Mass and pronounced the final absolution in the chapel where Monsignor O'Beirne had been ordained and celebrated his first Solemn Mass. Burial was in Calvary Hill Cemetery, with the Most Rev. A. Daugherty, Auxiliary Bishop of Dallas, conducting the services at the grave.

Born in Rochester, N. Y., Nov. 3, 1879, Monsignor O'Beirne studied for the priesthood in St. Bernard's Seminary, and served five years on the faculty of the University of Dallas.

Funeral services for Anna W. Furlong, a Mendon resident for more than 50 years, were held in St. Catherine's Church, Mendon, on April 5, 1950.

Mrs. Furlong was the daughter of Jesse MacAllister and John White of Wolfe Island, Ontario, Canada. She came to Rochester at an early age and was married to William J. Furlong in St. Patrick's Cathedral, Rochester, Jan. 17, 1899 by the late Archbishop Edward J. Hanna.

Mr. and Mrs. Furlong established their home and the first hardware business in Mendon. Mr. Furlong, who was active in civic and political affairs, and a member of the town board of Mendon for many years conducted his business until his death in 1922. Earl J. Broomfield, their son-in-law now conducts the business.

THROUGH THE initiative of Mrs. Furlong, St. Catherine's Church was built in Mendon. She asked Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid, first Bishop of Rochester if it were possible to have such a church. The Bishop gave full cooperation and the church was built under the guidance of the Rev. John Donnelly of Victor with which it was affiliated for a number of years.

Mrs. Furlong was president of St. Catherine's Guild and always active for the church and in civic affairs.

Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Earl J. Broomfield and Miss Sayde M. Furlong of Mendon; two grandchildren, William J. Broomfield of Honeyoy Falls and Sally Ann Broomfield of Mendon; one sister, Mrs. George Wakefield of Rochester, four nieces and two nephews.
