**Fr. Hedges Urges
Rosary in CDA

Corning — The Rev. L. John Hedges, assistant pastor of the Church of the Nativity, Brockport, was guest speaker at the 39th annual banquet of Court St. Joseph, Catholic Daughters of America, held Sunday evening at the Baran Steuben Hotel.

Father Hedges described his visit to a modern straggle in Toronto, Canada, last May. **Father McHugh,
Theologian, Dead**

Hawthorne — (NC) — Requiem Mass for the Very Rev. John A. McHugh, O.P., 69, one of the foremost Catholic theologians in the United States and co-holder of the unusual distinction of training every priest of a foreign mission community, was offered in Holy Rosary Church here, burial was in the cemetery at Maryknoll, N. Y.

Father McHugh, who died Easter Sunday at St. Agnes' Hospital in White Plains, held with the Rev. Charles A. Callan, O.P., the distinction of having taught every priest among the Maryknoll Missions, many of whom now have posts in Africa, Asia and South America. The two were loaned by the Dominican Order to the newly-founded seminary of the Catholic Foreign Mission Society of America (Maryknoll) in 1915 and have taught there since. Father McHugh was professor of dogmatic theology.
