Son of former residents of Groveland, the Rev. Dr. Bernard J. McLaughlin, vice chancellor of the Diocese of Buffalo, has been made a Papal Chamberlain with the title Very Reverend Monsignor by His Holiness Pope Pius XII according to word received by friends.

Monsignor McLaughlin is the son of Michael and Mary Curran McLaughlin of Buffalo, formerly of Groveland. He was born in Buffalo, Nov. 19, 1911, was educated at Visitation School, St. Joseph's Little Seminary and studied seven years at the Propaganda College, Rome where he was ordained Dec. 21, 1933.

On his return to Buffalo, Monsignor McLaughlin was appointed assistant at St. Joseph's New Cathedral, then Secretary to the Diocesan Matrimonial Court. He has been vice chancellor since May 30, 1948.
