In order to prote t families interested in adopting a child as well as to proter, the child and offer both the best secur its certain standards must be respected Adoption s a ser lous business and a lasting part as it stretches tejond the cradle into the years Families interested in adopting a child are referred to Catholic Charlties in many ways, sometimes it may be their pastor, doctor. lawyer, friends or other famil lies who have adopted a child.

During this interview the couple is assured that they will get a normal child in mind and body that legally everything will be all right and that every effort will be made to see that the cold placed with them will suit their type

The basic eligibility qualifications for adopting a child ares that the husbard and wife be practical Catholics, that they reside within the Diocese of Rochester and that they be under 40 years of age if they are interested in adopting a child under two years of age. Exceptions will be made for couples over 40 years of age

Financial security must be established also The organization does not look for wealthy homes but good dable Catholic homes where the income is consistent and the lamily can afford to share with the child.

The information obtained is

held strictly confidential and is used only to satisfy the Board of Directors of the Cathalie Charities of the Diocese of Rochester as to the stability of the adoption I'vo officers from the Board of Directors, the Vice President and Treas. urer are the ones authorized to sign the pecessary logal agreement or consent to the adoption. This information is also needed to meet the requirements of the Court where the petition for the adoption is pre-

When the sbove study is completed the adopting couple is notified as to its approval or disapproval If it is approved, the organization riskes every effort to place a child as soull as possible, but applicants must wait their turn, and they also have to wait until a child most suited to their home can he found.

### Child's Background

When the agency has a child ready to place, the adopting couple is notified and an appointment is made for them to come to the office. The child's background, potentialities and health are discussed with them, tion is explained They are told about his nationality extraction, the education of his parents and relatives as far as can be determined their habits, talents and skills Possible difficulties facing the adopting parents are cited. The agency however, will not 'ell who the child's parents are, nor where they live Neither will it tell the child's parents who the adoptive parents are or where

they live. The adoption worker will also give the birth history of the child and whether there were injuries or uppormaities at birth, the results of physical examinations of the child. All children placed for adoption are examined routinely by competent physicians and their hear'ts and lungs are examined. X-ray and flouroscopes are taken as well as blood tests.

Infants over six months of age are given a psychological study to determine their mental development If an infant is placed in an adoption home under six months, this study (Continued on Page 15)
