St. Joseph's Villa of Rochester is a modern, cottage type institution, which opened June 19, 1942, to provide group care for dependent children of the Roman Catholic Faith throughout the diocese of Rochester. The Institution represents the consolidation of St. Mary's Boys' Home of Rochester, St. Patrick's Girl's Home of Rochester and St. Joseph's Orphan Asylum of Rochester and Monroe County which were closed prior to and during 1942. The Sisters of St Joseph of the Diocese of Roch ester are responsible for the operation of at Joseph a Villa under the direction of the Board of Trustees

The next day and the five after were to be a very laffer ent kind of living for me. No more skipping school and di ting through all the perform ances of our small town movie house and finally having to go to what I called home. M. first day at the Vica began at the bells no contin dust his coming into our room over to my best and saving Come on Billy or you'll be late for breakfast." Then morning prayers, breakfast and our attle duties which I came to call proudly, 'MY

"From then on the day wasn't too different than I had expect ed reveept that I really went to school and gradually got ov er disliking it.) Home at 11 30 to a good dinner. I still remem ber the 'essert we had that home-made choco first day late ice cream' Back home again at 3 30, lunch and then play till 5 30 in charge of a young man who was called the Recreation Leader. We had fun playing the games that went with the season.

"Summer vacation is a happy time with many outings and picnics given by different guilds and organizations who are all so good to us. Sometimes we are their guests at outside activities and sometimes the picnics are held here in our own picnic groves.
