

### Louis F. Budenz To Talk at Kilmer Club Breakfast

Louis F. Budenz, former editor of the communist Daily Worker and presently Professor of Economics at Fordham University, will be the guest speaker at the 4th Annual Communion Breakfast of the Joyce Kilmer Club of Blessed Sacrament parish in the Sheraton Hotel Sunday May 28.

MR. BUDENZ, currently in the national spotlight for his revelations of Communist infiltration in the government, has been assisting the FBI in investigation of un-American activities since his renunciation of Communism in 1945. As an avowed Communist for 15 years he held a high ranking post in the party's inner circle.

### City's Historical Background To Feature Art Exhibit Of Nazareth College Artists

Early history of Rochester depicted in two murals will feature the Fine Arts exhibit displaying the work of Nazareth College seniors Friday, Saturday and Sunday, May 12, 13 and 14, in the Administration building of the college, on East Avenue.

Invitations have been issued to friends of the Fine Arts graduates for a private showing Friday, May 12 from 4 to 9:30. Undergraduates in the Fine Arts Department will act as guides and hostesses and will be in charge of refreshments. Exhibit is open to the public Saturday, from 2 to 9:30 and Sunday from 10 to 4:30.

HIGHLIGHTING THE exhibit are two murals which will be on display in the tunnel leading from the Administration building to the cafeteria and gym building. Easter Sunday 1850 in Rochester is the scene of the mural executed by this year's class, which pictures a congregation in the air of the day wedding its way to St. Patrick's Church. The church shown in the painting is the second St. Patrick's, a Gothic building built by the congregation in 1833 at the corner of Platt and Frank Streets, site of St. Pat's Cathedral which was torn down in 1937 when the property was sold to Eastman Kodak Company for an office building.

The other mural is another in the series of paintings describing the early history of Rochester which was begun by senior art students several years ago. A scene in the life of Kateri Tekakwitha, and an incident in Jesuit missionary history are in this series.

IN COMMEMORATION of the 300th anniversary of the Sisters of St. Joseph, the seniors are also painting a mural of a Sister of St. Joseph receiving three orphans from their sorrowing father in the orphanage at LePuy, France, in 1650.

There are nine Fine Arts seniors in this year's class, the largest number of graduates since the major in Fine Arts was established. Three of the young women will teach Art in the public schools. Miss Helen LaRow, Elba, New York; Miss Catherine Coughlin, Elba; and Miss Jean Virel, 18 Lawrence Terrace, Rochester. Graduating from the Interior Decorating course are Miriam Garry, Albany; Carol Cleary, Avon; Frances McBride, 21 Randolph St., and M. Jacqueline Burgess, 214 Merrill St., Rochester. The two remaining seniors have majored in Fashion Illustration and Commercial Art, Miss Lola Griller, Philadelphia, Pa. and Audrey Bagin, 51 Kingsboro Road, Rochester.
