

Diocese Has Three Nursing Schools

A very attractive vocation offered to Catholic young women is that of professional nursing. Located in strategic areas of the Diocese of Rochester are three schools of nursing, all of which are registered and approved as professional schools of nursing, offering courses leading to a New York State Diploma as a Registered Nurse.

The largest of these schools is St. Mary's Hospital School of Nursing in Rochester, conducted by the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul with a registration of 139 students.

In the city of Elmira, the Sisters of St. Joseph conduct a large school of nursing in connection with St. Joseph's Hospital of that city. At the present time it has enrolled among its student body 120 young women from all sections of the diocese.

Hornell likewise affords the advantages of possessing a complete school of nursing in connection with the St. Thomas Mary Hospital. The Hospital is now being conducted by the Sisters of Mercy and at the present time it has a student body of 100.

All three of these diocesan schools of nursing enjoy the services of a priest professor of Religion and Medical Ethics. Religious activities, such as the Society of Our Lady, Catholic Students Mission Crusade and Choir give a distinctive Catholic atmosphere to all these Catholic institutions.
