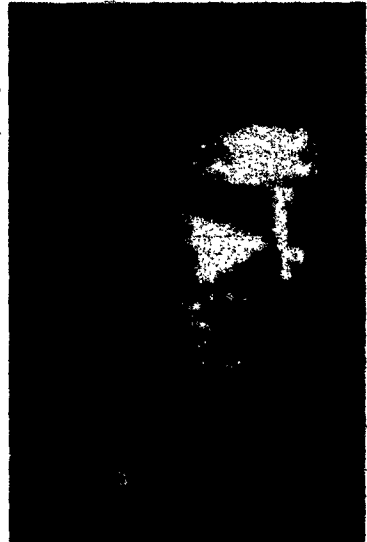


Rosary Broadcast Lists Mother's Day Tribute

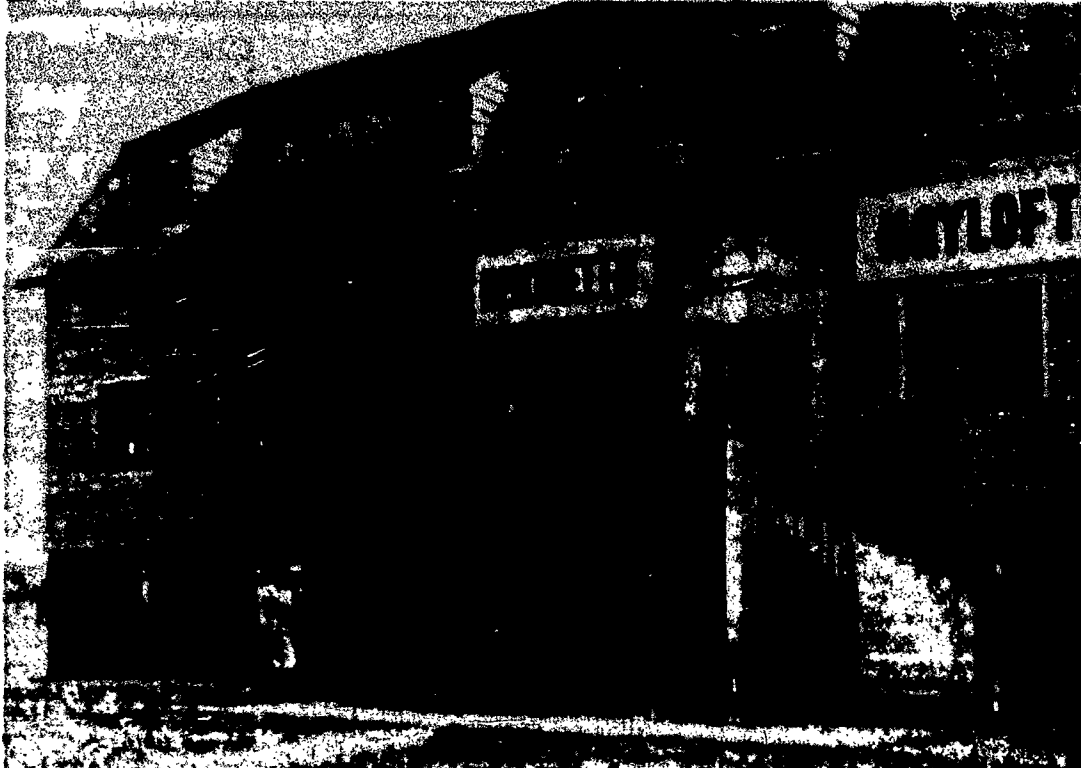

SON OF THE late Mr. and Mrs. Philip Lambert, Father Lambert has been editor of The Marianist, which is published at the University of Dayton, since 1945. Since his appointment, he has modernized the magazine, increased the circulation and improved it to the point where it has gained national recognition. Last year, it was judged second best Catholic magazine in the country at the Catholic press convention.

The Marianist editor was educated in Holy Family School, Rochester, before entering the Marianist preparatory seminary at Beacon, N. Y. He went on to St. John Seminary, Dayton, O., for philosophy and completed his theological studies at Fribourg, Switzerland, where he was ordained in 1939.

Before joining the staff of The Marianist in 1945, he taught in Marianist schools in Cleveland, Sioux City and Cincinnati, and at the University of Dayton.
