New St. James Church Dedication Memorial Day

The newly completed St. James Church, Brett Road in Brondeliquot, will be formally dedicated Memorial Day morning (Tuesday, May 30), by His Excellency Bishop Kearney.

The pulpit, sedilia, the sanctuary priedieu are of red oak lightly stained matching the pews which are low in modernistic fashion. The side altar is specially designed and erected of paneled oak. The communion-railing also of oak matches the design.

The floor of the church consists of douglas fir and in the aisles and sanctuary is covered by tan shade carpet. The flooring in the five vestibules is of the construction light gray shade.

The two confessionals in the rear are constructed of oak plywood augmented by light drapes.

The dual manual pipe organ was designed by Tellers of Erie with the assistance of Phillip Kreckel.

The basement hall has facilities for accommodating 600 people, with kitchen and stage planned for future development.

Adjacent to the church building as soon as the property is graded will be a parking lot ample for at least 100 cars.

Simultaneously a 13-room school is being erected also of sillicote block with buff brick exterior and it is expected that the school kindergarten through eighth grade will be finished in mid-summer. The school facilities will accommodate 520 pupils. Present registration is 240.

SISTERS OF MERCY who will teach in the new St. James School will have a temporary convent on the second floor of the school until such time as a permanent convent becomes necessary due to school registration growth.

The St. James Parish property was purchased in 1929 by the late Bishop O'Hern. The parish was announced last July by Bishop Kearney, with ground-breaking ceremonies last September 18. Services have been held in the new church on a temporary basis since Easter Sunday, April 9th.

The general construction work has been done by the Helendale Construction Co., with plumbing and heating by A. J. Heinze, Inc. and electrical work by Fantler Electric Inc. Architect is Edward M. Lorschelder.

Lay trustees of the new church are William M. Mulcahy and Joseph A. Renaud. Church auditors are Peter Skerrett and Howard Stauffer.

National Director Urges Understanding Of Youth

Coming — A full understanding of youth was urged on approximately 200 members and guests of the Aquinas Club of Corning by the Very Rev. Magr. Joseph E. Schleder, National Director of Catholic youth activities speaking at the club's third annual banquet.

Monsignor Schleder stressed his faith in youth speaking in the Knights of Columbus Home. He cited cases of crime among children and said that the public knew only the newspaper stories and not the stories behind the youth.

Youth of today, he explained, is the product of the "terrible twenties," when parents were dollar chasers, and of the eventual depression.

"Then," Monsignor Schleder said, "on a certain December 8 we handed them the whole dirty mess and sent them to take care of it. They rose to tremendous heights and became heroes a few months after it was held they were incapable of driving old jalopies."

"I HOPE WE never again sit in judgment. Our debt to them is too great. We must never again underestimate their ability, loyalty and love."

The speaker said the home is the kingdom of the boy and girl, with the father, the king, and the mother, the queen. Obedience, he said, can be obtained through love and devotion.

Monsignor Schleder who was introduced by Charles Golber, president of the policy committee of the Aquinas Club and a member of the faculty of Corning Free Academy, is well known for his work among youth.

Although ordained only 14 years ago he has attained many honors, among them the appointment by Pope Pius XII as one of a board of seven to direct the International Bureau of Catholic youth which includes the youth of the entire world.

A recent honor was his elevation to the rank of Papal Chamberlain by His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, with the title of Very Reverend Monsignor. In May of this year he was appointed advisor to the World Federation of Catholic Girls at Ghent, Belgium.

'Mission Sunday Of Sick' Plea Urges Visitations

"Go to the Sick" is the plea issued by the Propagation of the Faith Society, which is promoting a personal contact campaign to encourage observance of Mission Sunday of the Sick on Pentecost, Sunday, May 28 with the offering of sufferings for conversion of souls.

The Society's National Office made this appeal for the resigned consecration of suffering: GO TO THE SICK—and tell them that the Holy Father wants their sufferings for the missions! Tell them that on May 28th the entire Church celebrates Mission Sunday of the Sick in the United States there are over 250 Catholic hospitals. In these hospitals there are over 100,000 sick! Every one of them must be reached!

THERE ARE over 1,000 hospitals of every kind in the United States with over 1,000,000 patients! We do not know how many of these are Catholics—but as many as there are—they too must be reached! Those who are well—you and I—must tell them about Mission Sunday of the Sick! We must tell them of the value of their sufferings—and how much the missions need them!

TELL THEM of the sufferings of the Little Flower hidden away in a French convent, who became not only a great saint—but Patroness of the Mission! Tell them about St. Bernadette, suffering agonizing pain herself, but who brought miraculous cures for others through the Mother of God at Lourdes! Tell them about the great men, women and children who became saints of God because they were willing to suffer for Him!

TELL THEM of the countless souls that were brought to God because someone prayed or suffered for them!

Prayer cards and posters have been distributed in the diocesan parishes, hospitals and in homes for the aged, according to the Very Rev. Magr. John C. Randall, Director of the Rochester Diocesan Office of the Society.

Monsignor Randall emphasized that formal prayers are not necessary for the Pentecost of missions. All that is required is an act of the will, the sick offering up their sufferings, he said. He recommended, however, that the sick read over during the day the suggested ejaculations: "Agonizing Jesus, I unite my sufferings to Thine that Thy Name may be known and loved throughout the world."

University of Nagoya; in the Philippines, and in the Indies.

In the United States, a seminary is conducted for Negro boys and 20 Negro priests have been ordained. A Negro Brotherhood is a feature of the society.

On its diamond jubilee the Society numbers among its members a Cardinal, 2 Archbishops, 13 Bishops, 6 Prefect Apostolics, 2300 priests, 1300 brothers, 750 major seminarians and 2,300 college and high school students. Its growth is attributed to Father Janssen's devotion to the Holy Spirit, learned in his parental home.

HERE IN ROCHESTER diocese, the Society's foundation numbers approximately 400 priests, brothers and students.

The latest addition, the clerical novitiate, is a three-story building connected with the Church and the old faculty building. Constructed with brick exterior, the new building will house about 100 novices.

On the main floor are offices and guests rooms. The second and third floors are constructed for classrooms, novices' quarters, recreation hall and dormitories. Approximately 40 novices are now housed in the new building, and 60 are expected next year.
